THE PREPARED STOCK AND POULTRY FEEDS INDUSTRY, 1941.

The prepared stock and poultry feeds industry is an important factor in the agricultural development of the Dominion, in so far as it relates to animal husbandry and poultry raising. In addition to the feed grown by farmers themselves, when crop conditions are favourable, large quantities of scientifically blended feeds are produced annually by manufacturers of prepared stock and poultry feeds. For the year 1941 the output of this industry was valued at \$19,769,235 requiring the labour of 1,532 persons whose remuneration amounted to \$1,938,439. The value of the grain and other materials used totalled \$15,165,707 while the capital invested in fixed and current assets was \$10,510,540. In 1941 there were 118 establishments reporting in this industry, distributed by provinces as follows: Prince Edward Island 2, Nova Scotia 1, New Brunswick 4, Quebec 26, Ontario 43, Manitoba 5, Saskatchewan 2, Alberta 8 and British Columbia 27.

In addition to the prepared stock and poultry feeds produced in this industry, large quantities are also produced in other industries, notably, "flour and feed mills" and "slaughtering and meat packing" establishments. The production of prepared stock and poultry feeds by all industries in 1941 totalled 496,778 tons. Of this amount 304,532 tons were reported by the "prepared stock and poultry feeds" industry and 192,246 tons by other manufacturing industries and retail stores mixing feeds. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of 83,521 tons in the total production of prepared stock and poultry feeds by all industries. For details of production see Tables 2 and 3.

In order to obtain comprehensive statistics on the production of prepared stock and poultry feeds, a special survey has been made since 1939 of producers of mixed feeds, whose main operations do not consist of the production of these commodities.

The feeds and other products shown in table 2 were reported by firms whose main business consists of the manufacture of prepared stock and poultry feeds and by firms who are primarily dealers in grains and feeds but who produce considerable quantities of mixed feeds. In addition to the stock and poultry feeds produced by these firms, large quantities of mixed feeds, etc. are also produced by firms who are reporting under other industrial classifications such as "slaughtering and meat packing", "flour and feed mills", "chemicals", "breakfast foods", etc. In this second group are also included a large number of retail flour and feed stores who produce feeds on a small scale.

All firms manufacturing mixed feeds must register their formulae with the Plant Products Division of the Department of Agriculture. The Bureau has endeavoured to obtain statistics from all firms licensed to produce mixed feeds. Firms producing mixed feeds who are not reporting under the prepared stock and poultry feeds industry were required to give details of their production only. The quantities of mixed feeds reported by the 222 firms reporting under this category are included in tables 3(a) and 3(b).
