THE FISH PROCESSING INDUSTRY

1952

The tables which follow present statistics for establishments engaged in processing fish at the secondary industrial level. These establishments are normally regarded as food manufacturing and as such constitute an integral part of the Bureau's industrial statistics of the Foods and Beverages group. Fishermen mainly engaged in the primary aspect of the industry also often process the fish they land to a certain degree, but their operations are not included here. Consequently the tabular matter of this bulletin will differ from that published in "Fisheries Statistics of Canada, 1952". Furthermore the inland areas (Ontario, Prairie Provinces and Yukon and Northwest Territories) are not included in the survey although some fish processing is done there. It should also be noted that the Province of Newfoundland was not included prior to 1950.

Some of the salient features of the 1952 figures are mentioned below.

- The number of plants remained virtually unchanged, 635 in 1952 against 636 in 1951 although British Columbia and Newfoundland showed an increase of 9 and 5 plants, respectively.
- The selling value of products produced at \$134,725,000 decreased 17% from \$163,010,000 in 1951.
- Salaries and wages of \$24,426,000 in 1952 was a slight drop (1%) from the 1951 figure of \$24,744,000.
- Cost of materials in 1952 (\$86,458,000) decreased substantially from 1951; a drop of 15%. Cost of materials is largely composed of purchases of fish.
- Employment fell off 23% in 1952, when 14,354 were employed, from the 1951 figure of 18,706.
