


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

THE FISH PROCESSING INDUSTRY

1953

The tables which follow present statistics for establishments engaged in processing fish at the secondary industrial level. These establishments are normally regarded as food manufacturing and as such constitute an integral part of the Bureau's industrial statistics of the Foods and Beverages group. Fishermen mainly engaged in the primary aspect of the industry also often process the fish they land to a certain degree, but their operations are not included here. Consequently the tabular matter of this bulletin will differ from that published in "Fisheries Statistics of Canada, 1953". Furthermore the inland areas (Ontario, Prairie Provinces and Yukon and Northwest Territories) are not included in the survey although some fish processing is done there.

Some of the salient features of the 1953 figures are mentioned below.

- The number of plants in operation fell from 635 in 1952 to 607 in 1953.
- The selling value of products produced at \$137,085,700 increased 2% from \$134,725,300 in 1952.
- Salaries and wages of \$23,169,600 were lower by 5% than the 1952 figure of \$24,426,400.
- Cost of materials used by the industry, \$85,773,200, was 1% lower than the \$86,458,000 reported in 1952.
- Employment fell off 5% in 1953, when 13,623 were employed, from the 1952 total of 14,354.
