




SUMMARY OF STORAGE REPORTS, 1939.

Preliminary and revised data of the holdings of Canadian food commodities were published in monthly reports throughout the year 1939, the figures representing the quantities on hand at the opening of business on the first of each month. The data herein are the finally revised figures of these inventories, together with some statistical measurements and graphic representations.

The monthly publications were:

"Advance Preliminary Statement, Stocks of Butter,  
Cheese and Eggs in the Principal Cities of Canada."

"Stocks of Dairy and Poultry Products."

"Cold Storage Holdings of Meat and Lard."

"Storage Holdings of Fish."

"Stocks of Canadian Fruit and Vegetables."

The Advance Preliminary Statement was published on the second business day of each month; the other reports were issued on the tenth of each month.

Storage holdings of fish, formerly included with meat, were issued as a separate report, as most fish firms are not interested in meat and many meat firms are not concerned with fish.

Including the fruit inspectors of the Dominion Department of Agriculture, who reported the holdings of fresh fruit and vegetables, there were almost 3,000 reporting concerns. Of the establishments reporting, 1,647 (including dairy factories) reported butter, 1,446 (including dairy factories) reported cheese; 59 firms reported concentrated milk products owned by them anywhere in Canada; 316 submitted data on shell eggs (fresh and cold storage); 102 held frozen eggs; 240 reported dressed poultry; 177 meat; 139 lard; 152 fish, and 84 reported frozen and sulphured fruit.

The reporting showed improvement during 1939. Some dairy factories and a very few of the other types of organizations failed to send in their schedules promptly. This delinquency resulted in much correspondence and made it difficult to issue the reports on time.

The inspection staff was generally received courteously and co-operation was given by the firms in the inspection of stocks and of records. This inspection service has been of value to the industries concerned. It is educational to managers of dairy factories, as they are shown how to fill in the schedules and how to keep records, and it is assuring to all firms to know that data reported are being carefully scrutinized at the reporting establishments as well as at the Bureau.

To the many officials of the Dominion and Provincial Governments who have been of great assistance in the collection of data throughout the year grateful acknowledgments are tendered. To the firms and the members of their staffs responsible for completing the schedules grateful thanks are extended.








