



SUMMARY OF STORAGE REPORTS, 1941

Storage reports of primary and secondary food commodities have been compiled monthly since 1917, when, during the first World War, compilations of cold storage holdings were an integral part of a "Cost of Living" investigation which was conducted by a Royal Commission. The stocks of the same commodities are obtained to-day, but in response to requests of the different sections of the food industry, the detail is now greater. Data covering a period of twenty years were consolidated in a publication entitled, "Wholesale Stocks of Food Commodities in Canada in Cold and Common Storage 1920-1939", which was issued in July 1940.

The summary in the following pages contains the final data of monthly storage for 1941, the twenty-fourth year of compilations of stocks on hand of Dairy and Poultry Products, Meat, Lard, Fish, Fruit and Vegetables. Stocks of creamery butter and cheese in dairy factories were obtained by provincial officials in each province, compiled on the sixth of each month and the totals telegraphed to Ottawa on that evening. Stocks of fresh fruit and vegetables were collected by inspectors of the Marketing Service, Fruit Division, Dominion Department of Agriculture, who forwarded the data as special farms. All other data were obtained from schedules received directly by this Bureau, including car-loads of butter, eggs and poultry "In Transit" reported by the two railway companies.

An advance preliminary statement of the stocks of butter, cheese and eggs in nine of the principal cities of Canada was published on the second business day of each month. The data for this publication were obtained by a government official in each city who compiled the figures and telegraphed the totals to Ottawa. The regular monthly reports of the holdings of all the commodities mentioned above were released at four p.m. on the tenth of each month. The data were also released to the Press and to the two telegraph companies at the hour of publication. Any person desiring to obtain telegraphic information on the quantities of food commodities on hand could arrange for this service through his nearest telegraphic agent. Care was taken that the published figures were as accurate as was humanly possible. All work was checked and as entries were made in each classification a comparison was also made with the figures of the previous month. If there was any large difference, which did not follow the general trend of the holdings of other firms, confirmation was requested by telegram.

There were 780 visits made by our inspector during the year, of which 743 were inspections of books and stocks, the remainder consisting of visits to government officials and of special investigations to see whether certain firms dealing in food products ought to be reporting.

The final monthly data submitted herein consist of (1) stocks held in all Canada (2) holdings by provinces of dairy and poultry products, meat and fish, and the percentage of each commodity held in each section of the Dominion, (3) quantities of dairy and poultry products held in nine of the principal cities and the percentage relationship of each such product to the total Canadian stocks, and (4) the net storage movement, in or out, throughout the year, of the most important commodities. In addition charts are given to show graphically the net storage movement, the cities' and Dominion's holdings and the seasonal variation of the holdings of some of the products.

All this information has been made possible through the courteous co-operation of Dominion and Provincial officials and through the monthly efforts of hundreds of individuals on the staffs of firms in every province of Canada, to all of whom are extended grateful thanks.








