

SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE REPORTS -- 1948

Final revised figures on the stocks of food commodities held in dairy factories, cold storage warehouses and other wholesale establishments, including meat packing plants at the opening of business on the first day of each month in 1948 are published in this summary bulletin. Graphical presentation of the data appears in a special section following the tables.

Creamery butter stocks showed the usual seasonal pattern throughout the year, reaching a low level at May 1 and the year's high at November 1. On May 1 the stocks were 5,331,000 pounds and at November first 54,008,000 pounds. These figures include imported butter and butter in transit. The weekly press release on the stocks of creamery butter in nine of the principal cities of Canada, first issued on May 9, 1947 was continued throughout the year and the data are included in this summary.

Cheese stocks were higher than in 1947 during the first half of the year and also on August 1, but on July 1 and from September to December 1 there were slight reductions. The high point of the year was on September 1, after which there were the usual seasonal declines which almost paralleled figures for the preceding year.

Stocks of evaporated whole milk, the main concentrated milk item, in the hands of manufacturers were much lower during the first half of the year than in the same period in 1947. In the last half, however, stocks moved to a higher level. Holdings reached a 1948 high point on October 1 when 27,446,000 pounds were held; in 1947 stocks reached the year's high of 26,595,000 pounds on June 1.

Stocks of shell eggs were slightly below the 1947 totals during the first quarter of 1948. They were moderately higher than in 1947 during the second quarter but consistently lower during the last half of the year. Holdings of frozen eggs were fairly constant throughout the year, the high point being on July 1 when 24,403,000 pounds were on hand, and the low of 1,487,000 pounds on December 1. Dressed poultry holdings were highest on January 1 and at the lowest level on September 1. From September 1 to December 1 there was a steady rise, although the December 1 figure was 18,380,000 pounds below that for January.

Meat stocks were higher than in 1947 for all reporting periods except December 1. During the first half of the year they were quite uniformly maintained at a much higher level than during the previous year. A rapid reduction in stocks began in June and the low point for the year, 63,732,000 pounds was reached at October 1.

Quantities of fish in warehouses at the first of each month were close to those of 1947 up to August 1. From then until November 1 they were lower but December 1 holdings were practically unchanged from 1947. This year there was a new alignment of data on fish stocks, classifications being changed to give separate figures for sea and inland fish.

The high point for apple holdings was on December 1 when the stocks totalled 5,129,432 bushels as compared with 6,545,986 bushels on December 1, 1947. In 1948 the low point of the year was reached on September 1 when there were only 14,504 bushels on hand. The 1947 low was on August 1 when the stocks were 19,590 bushels.

Stocks of frozen fruit in "packages under 10 lb." were consistently higher in each month during 1948 than in the previous year. Stocks of frozen fruit in "containers 10 lb. and over" averaged only slightly higher than in the previous year during the first half of 1948 but were considerably greater during the last half. Stocks of fruit in preservatives were also slightly higher in 1948 as compared with the holdings of the previous year.

Grateful acknowledgment is extended to the Dominion and Provincial officials throughout Canada and to the personnel of individual firms who fill in the monthly schedules. Without their help it would be impossible to present these data.


