

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## INTRODUCTION

This report is a summary of revised data on the stocks of food commodities held in dairy factories, public cold storage warehouses and other storage and wholesale establishments such as meat packing plants and the central warehouses of chain and departmental stores, as at the first business day of each month during 1950. The form of presentation is similar to that followed in previous annual issues of this report. It will be noted that holdings of ice cream at manufacturers level is a new series started in 1950. The continued co-operation of the many individuals responsible for submitting monthly schedules and the valuable assistance given by officials of the federal and provincial governments in collecting and processing data is gratefully acknowledged.

Stocks of creamery butter in 1950 ranged between the low of 27,875,000 lb. at April 1 and 70,308,000 lb. at October 1, the highest level reached during the year. This was slightly above the 1945-49 five-year average October 1 holdings of 69,253,000 lb. but about 6,600,000 lb. below October 1, 1949. Cheese stocks were considerably higher than in 1949 from January to September but December 1 stocks of 28,393,000 were about 40 per cent less than at December 1, 1949. Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by manufacturers declined sharply from January through April reaching a low point of 6,555,000 lb. and throughout the remaining months the stocks ranged from 30 to 50 per cent below the 1949 level.

Stocks of shell eggs conformed to the usual seasonal pattern but were moderately below the 1949 levels from February to September. Dressed poultry holdings during the first half of 1950 ranged well above the below normal levels of 1949 but last quarter increases in stocks were less pronounced than in 1949.

Stocks of pork products were well below the 1945-49 five-year average during the first half of the year but were considerably above 1949 levels from May to October. Quantities in storage July to October coincided almost exactly with the five-year average level but at December 1 stocks of 29,801,000 lb. were 19.6 per cent below the five-year average and 16.1 per cent below December 1, 1949. Holdings of beef and veal were also considerably below 1949 and the five-year average levels throughout the year. Seasonal fluctuation was not sharp. Stocks declined from 29,742,000 lb. at January 1 to a low of 16,945,000 lb. at July 1, and then gradually increased to 29,615,000 lb. at December 1. Total meat stocks were at comparatively low levels from January to May, near the average of the preceding five years from June to September and dropped below 1949 and five-year average levels during the last three months of 1950.

Quantities of fish held in warehouses followed the normal pattern, with the lowest holdings at May 1 and the year's peak at November 1. The average holdings during the last three months were moderately above those of the previous year.

Stocks of fresh fruits and vegetables are now reported only during the storage period November 1 to June 1 inclusive. July 1 to October 1 holdings of these commodities represent largely only the week-to-week or day-to-day moving inventories. Apple stocks were appreciably greater than in 1949 from January to April while year end stocks were slightly lower but the major into-storage movement occurred before November 1 in 1950 whereas it took place during November in 1949.
