

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- I N T R O D U C T I O N -

This report is a summary of revised data on the stocks of food commodities held in dairy factories, public cold storage warehouses and other storage and wholesale establishments such as meat packing plants and the central warehouses of chain and departmental stores, as at the first business day of each month during 1952. The continued co-operation of the many individuals responsible for submitting monthly schedules and the valuable assistance given by officials of the federal and provincial governments in collecting and processing data is gratefully acknowledged.

Stocks of creamery butter during 1952 were considerably higher than in 1951 and opposite to the 1951 situation by being consistently higher than the five-year average. During the April-May period when butter stocks are normally at their low point, there were approximately 17 million pounds in 1952 as compared with 10 million pounds in 1951. This difference in stocks of butter increased during the following high production period until in October, 1952 there were 77 million pounds in storage, 14 million pounds higher than at the same time in 1951.

Monthly stocks of cheese were maintained at a higher level throughout 1952 than in 1951, being very similar to the five-year average stocks for the first nine months of the year. Cheese stocks showed the usual September increase but were then maintained at an unusually high level for the remainder of the year, being over 9 million pounds higher at December 1, 1952 than at the same date in 1951.

Monthly stocks of evaporated whole milk during 1952 showed a marked increase over the same months of 1951, being 11 million pounds greater at the low point in April and 34 million pounds higher at the October 1 peak stock date.

Egg stocks in 1952 rose from only slightly above 1951 at January 1 to a June 1 holding about 220 thousand cases higher than at the same date in 1951. During the latter part of 1952 stocks of eggs dropped sharply to a point slightly below the 1951 level in November and December. Frozen egg stocks were higher than in 1951 during all months of 1952, except January and February. Holdings of dressed poultry were very considerably higher during the first eight months of 1952 than in 1951 but dropped below during September and were 26 per cent lower at December 1, 1952 compared with December 1, 1951.

Stocks of pork products, excluding canned pork, showed a very marked increase over those of 1951 for all months. Whereas the 1951 level of holdings were below the five-year average, the 1952 stocks were higher in all months, especially during the February to July period. Holdings of beef and veal were very similar to those of 1951 during the first five months of 1952, but were considerably lower than the five-year average. A sharp increase in stocks took place during May and monthly stocks during the remainder of 1952 were maintained at a level higher than for the same months of both 1951 and the five-year average. The 1952 total meat stocks followed the same seasonal pattern as in 1951 but were at a markedly higher level.

Stocks of frozen fruit and in preservatives were higher than in 1951 throughout the first six months of the year and generally lower during the latter six months, especially when an August increase in 1951 was not matched in 1952. Apple holdings were lower at each reporting date during 1952.









# SEASONAL VARIATION IN STOCKS OF FOOD COMMODITIES IN CANADA
