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

## SUMMARY

There was a net reduction of about 12.4 million pounds in creamery butter stocks during 1956. While holdings were higher than in 1955 during the first half of the year a gradual and progressive decline from 1955 levels was indicated for each reporting date between July 1 and November 1.

Stocks of cheddar cheese were consistently below 1955 levels till the peak of storage at November 1 at which time the 45.2 million pounds held coincided almost exactly with stocks at this date in 1955 and with the five year average for this date. Year-end stocks were 39.6 as compared with 38.2 million pounds a year ago. Stocks of other factory cheese, excluding process cheese, varied within a narrow range of 1.6 to 2 million pounds throughout the year. Stocks of process cheese moved within a narrower range than in 1955. The season's low at June 1 was 2.9 and the high at December 1 was 3.7 million pounds.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk followed the usual seasonal pattern reaching a peak of 62.5 million pounds at September 1 but were at levels 3 to 8 million pounds below the five year average during the last 7 months of the year. Skim milk powder holdings were consistently well above 1955 levels till November but the year-end stock of 7.9 million pounds indicated a net reduction of 5.5 million pounds from the 13.4 on hand at the beginning of the year.

Stocks of shell eggs, cold storage and fresh, amounted to 53 thousand cases at the beginning of the year and only 177 thousand at the season's peak at June 1. These levels were substantially below the five year average and last year's levels. Net into-storage movement commenced during November and at year-end there were 119 thousand cases in storage. Stocks of frozen eggs were consistently lower than in 1955 at each reporting date except January 1 and moved within a range of 4.3 (May 1) to 6.8 million pounds (August 1).

Cold storage holdings of poultry meat were only moderately above 1955 levels till August 1 but increased rapidly during the fall and reached 44.9 million pounds at December 1, the seasonal peak, as compared with 30.7 million pounds in 1955. Year-end inventories totalled 41.8 million pounds as compared with 26.1 million last year.

Stocks of pork in storage were moderately greater than in 1955 but generally lower than the five year average stocks throughout the spring and summer months of 1956. They were appreciably below these levels during the fall months. Peak holdings at May 1, 1956 amounted to 54.8 million pounds as compared with a five year average of 57.9 million pounds at that date. The season's low at October 1 was 21.2 million pounds and year-end stocks were about 21.8 as compared with 36.6 million pounds at January 1, 1956.

Stocks of beef, including veal, reflected the high production and were above 1955 and five year average levels at every reporting date in 1956. Peak holdings at December 1 amounted to 44.9 million pounds and stocks at January 1, 1957 were 42.6 million pounds as compared with 37.5 at January 1, 1956.

Total meat inventories were appreciably higher than in 1955 during the first 8 months of the year and above 1951-1955 averages till June. Holdings during the fall conformed closely to previous patterns but, following a substantial out-of-storage movement during December, year-end stocks of domestic origin were 67.5 million as compared with 78.0 million pounds at the beginning of the year.

Inventory levels of frozen fruit and fruit in preservatives were relatively high during the first half of the year reflecting carryover from the generally favourable crops and large pack in 1955. Stocks on hand during the fall months approximated the five year average levels, considerably below those carried during the fall of 1955.

Stocks of apples at November 1, were at 6.5 million bushels, about 2 million bushels below stocks at the corresponding date in 1955. This low inventory at peak storage season was the same as in 1953. Potato stocks amounted to 30 million bushels at November 1, the peak of the storage season, as compared with 29.6 million bushels in 1955.






