


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STOCKS OF FOOD COMMODITIES IN COLD STORAGE AND OTHER WAREHOUSES

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



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SUMMARY

This report is a summary of revised monthly data for 1959 on the stocks of food commodities held in dairy factories, public cold storage warehouses and other storage and wholesale establishments, such as meat packing plants and the central warehouses of chain and department stores. The continued cooperation of the many individuals responsible for submitting monthly schedules and assistance given by the officials of Federal and Provincial Governments in collecting and processing data is again gratefully acknowledged.

Stocks of creamery butter were at record or near record levels at all reporting dates during 1959. At April 1, the season's lowest holdings amounted to 61.8 million pounds as compared with a 1958 low of 35.3 million pounds at May 1. The all time record high of 133.8 million pounds at October 1 was 20.0 million pounds above the peak at November 1 in 1958. The previous record high in creamery butter stocks was 127.9 million pounds at November 1, 1955. The net into-storage movement during 1959 of 11.8 million pounds, despite a decrease of 10.7 million pounds in production, reflects a fairly marked decrease in per capita consumption of butter in 1959.

Cheddar cheese holdings were moderately above five year average stocks throughout 1959 but were appreciably below 1958 holdings at all reporting dates except December 1 and at year-end. The season's low and high holdings were 32.3 and 59.4 million pounds at May 1 and October 1, respectively. Stocks at the end of the year were 52.5 million pounds, 4.7 million pounds above the 46.8 at the beginning of the year.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk were generally at a lower level than in 1958 but, followed the usual seasonal pattern. Low and high holdings for the year were 19.7 million pounds at April 1 and 66.9 at October 1, respectively in comparison with 22.1 and 80.6 million pounds at these reporting dates in 1958. Net out-of-storage movement for the year amounted to 3.2 million pounds.

Skim milk powder stocks amounting to 77.3 million pounds at the beginning of the year decreased consistently and moderately to 64.4 at August 1 and then dropped rapidly each month to reach the year's low of 21.7 million pounds at December 1. Net reduction of stocks in the year amounted to 55.5 million pounds.

Stocks of shell eggs were appreciably higher than in 1958 and also well above 5 year average holdings at all spring and summer reporting dates in 1959. Peak holdings at June 1 were 398,000 cases as compared with 259,000 in 1958 and the five year average of 310,000 cases. Out-of-storage movement followed the usual seasonal pattern of rapid decline after July 1 and by December 1, the low point, storage stocks were down to 53,000 cases in comparison with 56,000 at this date in 1958. Year-end stocks were 81,000 cases versus 101,000 last year.

Frozen egg holdings during 1959 coincided quite closely with the 5 year average seasonal movement, with winter stocks of 5 to 6 million pounds and peak summer stocks of almost 10 million.

With a record carry-over from 1958, poultry meat stocks at the beginning of 1959 amounted to 46.8 million pounds and were well above average holdings throughout the year. Seasonal out-of-storage movement reduced these stocks to 18.0 million pounds at August 1 as compared with the 1958 low of 11.7 million pounds at the same date. Into-storage movement during the fall was less pronounced than in 1958 and peak holdings at December 1 were 47.3 as compared with 62.7 million pounds. Stocks of turkey meat, exceptionally high with a peak of 33.4 million pounds in 1958, amounted to 30.8 at December 1, 1959 but were reduced to 11.9 million pounds at year-end as compared with 18.4 carried over from 1958.

The outstanding feature of meat storage stocks in 1959 was the large holdings of pork products accumulated by the Agricultural Stabilization Board in maintaining the fixed floor price on hogs. Total pork stocks excluding canned, at January 1 were 47.6 million pounds of which 32.2 million pounds was frozen pork. Peak holdings at May 1 amounted to 114.0 million pounds of which 96.9 million pounds was frozen pork. A canning program, commencing in April for Stabilization Board account, gradually reduced holdings of frozen pork. By year-end the Board held about 111 million pounds of canned pork and pork stocks, frozen, fresh and cured were 58.7 million pounds of which 43.5 million pounds was frozen pork.

Quantity of beef and veal in storage differed from the normal pattern only in that stocks from April to October were moderately greater, averaging about 33 million pounds as compared with a five-year average of about 30 million. However, the increase in stocks during the fall, was more moderate than usual. Net out-of-storage movement for the year was 4.6 million pounds.

Inventory holdings of fruits, frozen and in preservatives, were about 10 million pounds above the five year average and exceeded 1958 stocks by approximately the same amount at reporting dates during the first half of the year. This situation arose from the better than average crop for most fruits in 1958. However, with a lighter crop in 1959 stocks did not reach 1958 levels during the pack season but did exceed average holdings of 40 million pounds during fall months by about 6 million pounds.

At November 1, the peak of the apple storage season, stocks of apples amounted to 8.3 million bushels as compared with 9.4, 8.6 and 6.5 million bushels at this time in 1958, 1957 and 1956 respectively. Year-end carry-over at 5.2 was 1.1 million bushels lower than last year.

Potato stocks were moderately lower at all reporting dates in 1959 than in 1958. Peak holdings at November 1 were 16.8 million hundredweight as compared with 19.1 in 1958 and year-end stocks 11.3 versus 14.2.






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
