



## SUMMARY

Stocks of creamery butter were appreciably above previous levels at all reporting dates in 1960. Net increase in stocks between beginning and end of the year was from 105.7 million pounds to 113.8 million pounds, not including the accumulation of 15.5 million pounds of butter oil which is equivalent to about 19.4 million pounds of butter. Lowest holdings of creamery butter during the year were 76.7 million pounds at April 1. Peak holding amounted to 139.0 million pounds at October 1. Increased stocks despite a 2 per cent decrease in production reflected a further marked decrease in per capita consumption of this product.

Cheddar cheese stocks were about 10 million pounds higher than the average for the previous five years throughout most of 1960. Low and high holdings were 42.4 and 64.6 million pounds at May 1 and October 1, respectively. Holdings at the end of the year were 55.2 million pounds, 2.7 million pounds above the 52.5 at the beginning of the year and 9.4 million pounds above the 1955-59 average of stocks at year-end.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk were below the levels of recent years during the first quarter of 1960 and dropped to 11.5 million pounds at April 1 compared with the 1959 low of 19.7 million pounds at that date. Normal seasonal build-up of stocks took place from April to August and the stocks stood at 64.2 million pounds for the season's high at September 1. Year-end stocks were 45.5 million pounds compared to 44.6 last year.

Skim milk powder stocks were at moderate levels during 1960 following the liquidation of large holdings during the latter half of 1959. Peak level for the year was 31.0 million pounds at August 1 and year-end stocks amounted to 24.1 million pounds compared to 21.9 last year.

Stocks of shell eggs were at significantly lower levels during 1960 than in recent years. Peak holdings at June 1 were 195,000 cases compared to a 1955-59 average of 328,000. Frozen egg inventories coincided quite closely with the usual seasonal pattern, bulging to only 8.8 million pounds for the seasons peak at September 1 and then gradually decreasing to 5.8 million pounds at year-end.

Stocks of poultry meat, exceptionally high during the first half of 1959 following a record carry-over from 1958, were closely in accord with normal supplies during 1960. Peak holdings at December 1 amounted to about 49.0 million pounds compared to 47.3 in 1959 but to 62.0 in 1958. Carry-over at year-end was 26.8 million pounds, almost the same as last year but well below the 46.8 million pounds carried over from 1958 to 1959. The 1960 carry-over of turkey meat was slightly lower, with heavy chicken and fowl slightly greater than at the end of 1959.

Excluding canned product about 58.6 million pounds of pork was carried over from 1959. This was increased to peak 1960 holdings of 63.8 million pounds at May 1. This compared with 114.0 million pounds at May 1, 1959. With sharply reduced production of hogs in 1960 stocks were rapidly depleted between June and October. Normal year-end stocks are approximately 30 million pounds of pork. In 1960 these were reduced to 23.1. Stocks of beef and veal were normal, ranging from 30.2 to 35.6 million pounds. Year-end stocks of all meat normally total about 75 million pounds. The 1960 carry-over was 68.2 million pounds.

Total inventory of fruits in storage was generally moderately lower in 1960 than in 1959 though still well above average till September. Through the fall of 1960 holdings were roughly equal to the average over the last 5 years but considerably lower than in 1959. Year-end stocks were 38.9 million pounds, a net reduction of over 10 per cent.

Peak apple stocks at November 1, 1960 at 8.2 million bushels were slightly lower than in 1959. Out-of-storage movement was somewhat more rapid and year-end carry-over was 4.8 million bushels compared to 5.2 last year and a five year average of 5.4 million bushels.

Potato stocks were moderately lower than in 1959 during the early part of the year since the carry-over to 1960 from 1959 was about 2.2 million hundredweight less than the 1958 year-end supply. At the start of the new season the stock position was almost identical in both years. November 1 holdings of 17.5 million hundredweight was reduced to 12.9 million hundredweight for carry-over into 1961.






**STOCKS OF CREAMERY BUTTER

IN 1960




**SEASONAL VARIATION IN STOCKS\***
