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## SUMMARY

Butter production during 1962 amounted to 365.5 million pounds, about 9.5 million pounds above the previous record output in 1961. The net increase in stocks of creamery butter was about 9.7 million pounds—from 126.7 million pounds at January 1, 1962 to 136.4 at January 1, 1963. However, the combined stocks of all butter and butter oil (the latter expressed as butter equivalent) rose 41.5 million pounds, from 197.5 to 239. This was in contrast to a net increase in combined stocks of 64.2 million pounds in 1961. The lowest volume of combined stocks, butter and butter oil, during the year was 176.5 million pounds at April 1 compared with 111.4 at the same date in 1961 while the highest levels at October 1, were 260.8 and 211.9 million pounds, respectively, in 1962 and in 1961. The increase in domestic disappearance with a consumer subsidy of 12 cents per pound as from May in 1962 resulted in a smaller net accumulation of stocks in 1962 than in 1961.

Stocks of cheddar cheese were well above year earlier levels during the first half of 1962, but with a marked increase in domestic disappearance and slightly greater exports than in 1961 holdings during the last half of the year were appreciably below year-earlier stocks and the net decrease for the year was 12.5 million pounds, down from 64.0 to 51.5 million pounds. This was moderately below the 1957 to 1961 five year average of 54.3 million pounds at January 1.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk during 1962 ranged from the low of 25.2 million pounds at May 1 to 66.4 million, the seasons' high, at October 1. Stocks at the beginning of the year, at 60.2 million pounds, were appreciably above average holdings but the build-up of stocks between May and October was less pronounced and year-end carryover dropped to 39.4 million pounds, a net decrease of about one third for the year.

Stocks of skim-milk powder amounted to 29.9 million pounds at the beginning of the year and decreased to a low point of 20.8 million pounds at April 1. These holdings were well below 5 year averages. Month-to-month increases from May through October brought holdings at November 1 to 59.2 million pounds, moderately above year-earlier and 5 year average stocks. Out-of-storage movement during November and December was less pronounced than usual leaving year-end stocks of 53.2 million pounds, a net increase of 23.3 million pounds for the year.

Month-to-month production of eggs has become quite uniform in recent years with peak-season production much less conspicuous than formerly. This pattern of production results in less seasonal fluctuation in the quantity of eggs held in storage. About 50,000 cases appear to be normal holdings to satisfy the requirements of the egg trade with somewhat larger quantities accumulated in May and June.

Stocks at January 1, 1962 and 1963 were 50,000 and 44,000 cases, respectively. However, during 1962 there was a more pronounced accumulation, to 128,000 cases at June 1, than in 1961 when the peak holding of 71,000 cases was reached at July 1. Frozen egg inventories increased gradually from about 3.0 million pounds at January 1, 1962 to peak holdings of 7.7 million pounds at August 1 and then declined to 4.7 million pounds by the year's end.

Total poultry meat in storage during the early months of 1962 was considerably greater than the five year average holdings. January 1 stocks amounted to 43.1 million pounds compared to 35.6 for the five year average at this date and 27.1 million pounds in 1961. By August 1 stocks had been reduced to 18.5 million pounds (16.1 million, a year earlier). Peak holdings, at December 1, were 62.9 million pounds, about 3 million pounds below the 1961 peak, and by year-end stocks were reduced to 37.6 million pounds. The net reduction in total year-end stocks was entirely attributable to appreciably lower holdings of chicken meat. The year end carryover of turkey meat at 26.7 million pounds was 6.5 million pounds more than in 1961.

Total stocks of the red meats amounted to 77.5 million pounds at January 1, 1962. Peak holdings of 79.7 million pounds were reached at April 1. During these early months of the year total holdings were considerably greater than in 1961. However, net out-of-storage movement from May to September exceeded that in 1961 to reach the seasons' low point of 55.8 million pounds at October 1 in contrast to the September 1 low of 65.8 million pounds in 1961. Stocks of pork were lower than last year throughout the summer and fall months with year-end holdings down to 19.8 million pounds compared to 27.1 last year and 58.6 in 1959. Stocks of beef and veal fluctuate less than pork stocks, both seasonally and from year to year. Net out-of-storage movement during 1962 was 1.5 million pounds, but from June to November holdings of beef and veal in 1962 were appreciably lower than in the previous year.

Total stocks of fruit held in frozen form and in preservatives averaged 8 to 9 million pounds more than in 1961 during the first six months of 1962. Blueberries, cherries and strawberries were held in still larger quantities than in 1961 when holdings of these kinds were generally higher than the normal amounts carried in recent years. Inventories during the fall months were close to year-earlier levels.

Peak holdings of apples at November 1, 1962, at 11.2 million bushels, were about 1.5 million bushels greater than in 1961 and 3 million bushels greater than in 1960. Year-end carryover amounted to 6.9 million bushels compared to 6.1 last year and to a five year average of 5.6 million bushels.








