


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## SUMMARY

Total factory butter production during 1963 amounted to 356.1 million pounds, about 9.6 million pounds below the record output in 1962. The net increase in stocks of creamery butter was about 1.3 million pounds — from 135.4 million pounds at January 1, 1963 to 136.7 at January 1, 1964. However, the combined stocks of all butter and butter oil (the latter expressed as butter equivalent) declined 18.4 million pounds, from 238.3 to 219.9. This was in contrast to a net increase in combined stocks of 40.8 million pounds in 1962, and the first decrease in stocks since the build-up began in 1958. The lowest volume of combined stocks, butter and butter oil, during the year was 204 million pounds at May 1, compared with 184.6 at the same date in 1962, while the highest levels at October 1, were 269.4 and 258.6 million pounds, respectively, in 1963 and in 1962. Record domestic disappearance coupled with exports resulted in a net reduction of stocks in 1963.

Stocks of cheddar cheese were well below year-earlier levels during the first eight months of 1963. There was a marked increase in cheddar production as a result of a higher subsidy payment for cheese milk effective from May 1. Holdings during the last third of the year were appreciably above year-earlier stocks and the net increase for the year was 6.3 million pounds, up from 51.5 to 57.8 million pounds. This was 3.5 million pounds above the 1958-62 five-year average of 54.2 million pounds at January 1. The domestic disappearance of cheddar cheese also reached a record level in 1963.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk during 1963 ranged from the low of 14.1 million pounds at April 1 to 60.2 million, the season's high, at October 1. Stocks of 39.4 million pounds at the beginning of the year, were appreciably below average holdings but the build-up of stocks between May and October was normal for the period. As a result of the close balance between production and total disappearance (domestic and foreign), the year-end carryover rose to 40.0 million pounds and the net increase was only 0.6 million for the year.

Skim milk powder stocks amounting to 53.5 million pounds at the beginning of the year decreased to less than half this amount by May 1, then rose moderately to 35.7 million pounds at September 1 before dropping off again to the year's low of 22.0 million pounds at December 1. Substantial export sales were responsible for the rapid drop in inventories during the early part of 1963. Net reduction of stocks in the year amounted to 32.5 million pounds.

Month-to-month egg production trends continue to be quite uniform with peak-season production less conspicuous than formerly. Volume of shell

eggs carried in storage during 1963 fluctuated within the narrow range of 35,000 cases to 86,000 cases indicating uniform clearance of egg supplies with only a moderate build-up of stocks. Frozen egg holdings amounting to 4.7 million pounds at January 1 dropped to the year's low at 3.4 million pounds at April 1 before reaching peak holdings of 7.7 million at August 1. Year-end holdings amounted to 4.0 million pounds.

Total poultry meat in storage during each month of 1963 was considerably greater than the five-year average holdings. January 1 stocks amounted to 38.9 million pounds compared to 35.7 for the five-year average at this date and above-average holdings of 43.1 million pounds in 1962. By July 1, stocks had been reduced to 22.2 million pounds (19.5 million, a year earlier). Peak holdings, at December 1, were 68.7 million pounds, almost 6 million pounds higher than the 1962 peak, but by year-end stocks were 2.0 million pounds below year earlier holdings to 36.9 million pounds. The net reduction in total year-end stocks was attributable to appreciably lower holdings of turkey meat. The year-end carry-over of turkey meat at 16.0 million pounds was 11.4 million pounds lower than in 1962.

Total stocks of the red meats starting with the year's low of 68.0 million pounds at January 1, 1963, did not reach peak holdings of 92.4 million pounds until December 1. The build-up of total holdings from April on were considerably greater than in 1962. Thus, a smaller net out-of-storage movement from May to September was indicated than in 1962. Stocks of pork were higher than last year throughout the summer and fall months with year-end holdings at 27.3 million pounds compared to 19.8 last year and 58.6 in 1959. Stocks of beef and veal fluctuate less than pork stocks, both seasonally and from year to year. Net in-to-storage movement during 1963 was 10.0 million pounds, with holdings of beef and veal in 1963 appreciably higher than in the previous year, particularly during the summer and fall months.

Total stocks of fruit held in frozen form and in preservatives were moderately lower during the first half of 1963, but higher during the remainder of the year than in 1962. Out-of-storage movement was only 0.6 million pounds and the year-end carryover was 46.9 million pounds.

Peak holdings of apples at November 1, 1963, at 12.4 million bushels, were about 1.2 million bushels greater than in 1962 and 2.7 million bushels above 1961 holdings. Year-end carryover amounted to 7.9 million bushels compared to 6.9 last year and to a five-year average of 5.6 million bushels.








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
**STOCKS OF CREAMERY BUTTER, CHEESE, EGGS AND POULTRY**




SEASONAL VARIATION IN STOCKS\* OF FOOD COMMODITIES
