



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STOCKS OF FOOD COMMODITIES IN COLD STORAGE AND OTHER WAREHOUSES

1964

SUMMARY

Total factory butter production during 1964 amounted to 356.3 million pounds, slightly above production in 1963 but 9.3 million pounds below the record output in 1962. The net decrease in stocks of creamery butter was about 43.1 million pounds—from 136.4 million pounds at January 1, 1964, to 93.3 million pounds at January 1, 1965. However, the combined stocks of all butter and butter oil (the latter expressed as butter equivalent) declined almost 119 million pounds, from 219.5 to 100.6. This compares with a net decrease in combined stocks of 18.8 million pounds in 1963, and the second successive year in which stocks have declined since 1958. In contrast to other years when holdings are generally lowest at May 1 and highest at October 1, combined stocks of butter and butter oil during 1964 showed a continuous decline from the highest volume at January 1 to the lowest at the end of the year. Record domestic disappearance coupled with record exports of both butter and butter oil resulted in a net reduction of stocks in 1964.

Stocks of cheddar cheese were above year-earlier levels during the first eleven months of 1964. Holdings at December 1 were slightly below the same date last year and the net increase for the year was 1.2 million pounds, up from 57.7 to 58.9 million pounds. This was 2.6 million pounds above the 1960-64 five-year average of 56.3 million pounds at January 1. Cheddar cheese production increased to 143.6 million pounds in 1964, and, except for the war years, 1940 to 1946, was the highest recorded in the past thirty-six years. The domestic disappearance of cheddar cheese also continued to rise and reached a new record level in 1964.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk during 1964 ranged from a low of 21.9 million pounds at May 1 to 55.3 million, the season's high, at August 1. Stocks of 41.9 million pounds at the beginning of the year were 5.2 million pounds below the 1959-63 five-year average but the build-up of stocks between May and October was appreciably below normal for the period. Exports of evaporated milk during 1964 were the highest since 1952 and as a result the year-end carryover dropped to 36.0 million pounds and the net decrease was 5.9 million for the year.

Skim milk powder stocks amounting to 21.0 million pounds at the beginning of the year declined to 16.0 million at May 1, then rose steadily to 40.2 million pounds at November 1, before dropping off to 28.4 million pounds at January 1, 1965. As a result of increased production of skim milk powder and a drop in export sales, the net increase in stocks was 7.4 million pounds for the year.

Despite increased egg production over each month of 1963, only a moderate build-up was indicated in stocks of shell eggs during 1964. Storage

supplies fluctuated between the low of 42,000 cases at January 1 and peak holdings of 94,000 cases at July 1. However, average monthly inventories of frozen eggs were the highest since 1959. Holdings amounting to 3.9 million pounds at January 1, the year's low, steadily rose to peak holdings of 9.7 million at September 1, before declining to 6.8 million pounds at the year-end.

Total poultry meat in storage during each month of 1964 was considerably greater than the 1959-63 five-year average holdings. January 1 stocks amounted to 37.9 million pounds compared to 36.4 million for the five-year average and 38.9 million pounds in 1963. Following an increase at February 1, stocks during 1964 were reduced to 27.2 million pounds at July 1 (22.2 million a year earlier). Peak holdings, at December 1, were 73.0 million pounds, 4.3 million pounds higher than the 1963 peak at the same date, and 14.3 million pounds above the five-year average. Carryover at year-end was 41.1 million pounds, 3.2 million above that carried over from 1963. The net increase in total year-end stocks was mainly due to the higher carryover of turkey meat, with most other poultry meat classifications slightly lower than at the end of 1963.

Total stocks of the red meat during each month of 1964 were considerably above year earlier levels, particularly in the first three months of the year when monthly holdings averaged 22.5 million pounds above 1963 levels. Peak holdings of 99.8 million pounds were reached at March 1, and the net out-of-storage movement from March to August exceeded that in 1963 to reach the seasons low point to 78.7 million pounds at September 1. Except at December 1, stocks of pork were higher than last year throughout 1964, with year-end holdings at 29.8 million pounds compared to 27.2 million last year and 19.8 million in 1962. Stocks of beef and veal fluctuate less than pork stocks, both seasonally and from year to year. Net in-to-storage movement during 1964 was 4.9 million pounds, with holdings of beef and veal moderately higher than in the previous year.

Total stocks of fruit held in frozen form and in preservatives were higher than year-earlier holdings during the March to June and August to December periods of 1964. In-to-storage movement was 7.0 million pounds and the year-end carryover was 54.2 million pounds.

Peak holdings of apples at November 1, 1964, at 11.2 million bushels, were 1.2 million bushels lower than in 1963 and almost the same as holdings in 1962. Year-end carryover amounted to 6.8 million bushels compared to 7.9 last year and to a five-year average of 6.2 million bushels.






5 YR. AVERAGE




**STOCKS OF CREAMERY BUTTER, CHEESE, EGGS AND POULTRY
IN CANADA AND IN NINE CITIES ON THE FIRST OF EACH MONTH IN 1964**


