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

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


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# STOCKS OF FOOD COMMODITIES IN COLD STORAGE AND OTHER WAREHOUSES

1965

## SUMMARY

Total factory butter production during 1965 amounted to 341.8 million pounds, about 14.5 million pounds below production in 1964 and 23.9 million pounds below the record output in 1962. The net decrease in stocks of creamery butter was about 18.2 million pounds—from 92.9 million pounds at January 1, 1965, to 74.7 million pounds at January 1, 1966. However, the combined stocks of all butter and butter oil (the latter expressed as butter equivalent) declined 24.6 million pounds, from 100.2 to 75.6. This compares with a net decrease in combined stocks of 119 million pounds in 1964, and the third successive year in which stocks have declined since 1958. The lowest volume of combined stocks, butter and butter oil during the year was 59.5 million pounds at May 1, compared with 169 million at the same date in 1964, while the highest level was 109.4 million pounds at October 1, compared with 161.6 million at the corresponding date a year earlier. Near record domestic disappearance coupled with a decline in creamery butter production resulted in a net reduction of stocks in 1965.

Stocks of cheddar cheese were above year-earlier levels for all months of 1965 except October. The net increase for the year was 3.1 million pounds, up from 58.5 to 61.6 million pounds. This was 4.1 million pounds above the 1960-64 five-year average of 57.5 million pounds at January 1. Cheddar cheese production increased to 152.1 million pounds in 1965, the highest since 1945 and the eighth highest production-year on record. The domestic disappearance of cheddar cheese was slightly below the record level in 1964, while exports were the highest since 1950.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk during 1965 ranged from a low of 15.0 million pounds at April 1 to 56.7 million, the season's high, at October 1. Stocks of 36.0 million pounds at the beginning of the year were 11.1 million pounds below the 1960-64 five-year average but the build-up of stocks between May and October was normal for the period and year-end carryover rose to 39.8 million pounds, a net increase of 3.8 million for the year.

Skim milk powder stocks amounting to 28.5 million pounds at the beginning of the year declined to 17.5 million at May 1, then rose steadily to 49.4 million pounds at October 1, before dropping off to 25.0 million pounds at January 1, 1966. Strong export demand resulted in near record sales of skim milk powder during 1965. Net reduction of stocks was 3.5 million pounds for the year.

Month to month egg production was quite uniform during 1965, with peak-season production less conspicuous than in other years. Storage supplies

fluctuated between the low of 43,000 cases at October 1 and peak holdings of 76,000 cases at June 1. However, average monthly inventories of frozen eggs were the highest since 1958. Holdings amounting to 6.9 million pounds at January 1, steadily rose to peak holdings of 10.0 million at September 1, before declining to the year's low of 4.3 million pounds at the year-end.

Total poultry meat in storage during each month of 1965 was considerably greater than the 1960-64 five-year average holdings. January 1 stocks amounted to 41.7 million pounds compared to 34.6 million for the five-year average and 37.9 million pounds in 1964. Following an increase at February 1, stocks during 1965 were reduced to 24.8 million pounds at August 1 (20.2 million a year earlier). Peak holdings at December 1, were 72.3 million pounds, 0.7 million pounds lower than the 1964 peak at the same date, but 8.4 million pounds above the five-year average. Carryover at the year-end was 42.6 million pounds, 0.9 million above that carried over from 1964. The net increase in total year-end stocks was mainly due to the higher carryover of turkey meat.

Total stocks of red meat during each month of 1965 were below year earlier levels except for January 1 and April 1 when monthly holdings were 7.3 and 1.6 million pounds above comparative holdings for 1964, respectively. Peak holdings of 94.2 million pounds at January 1 declined to 73.7 million at August 1, a net out-of-storage movement of 20.5 million pounds. Except at January 1, stocks of pork were lower than last year throughout 1965, with year-end holdings at 24.3 million pounds compared to 29.3 million last year and 27.2 million in 1963. Stocks of beef and veal fluctuate less than pork stocks, both seasonally and from year to year. Net in-to-storage movement during 1965 was 0.6 million pounds, with holdings moderately lower than in the previous year.

Total stocks of fruit held in frozen form and in preservatives were higher than year-earlier holdings during the first seven months of 1965 but dropped below year-earlier levels for the remainder of the year. Out-of-storage movement was 3.6 million pounds and the year-end carryover was 51.6 million pounds.

Peak holdings of apples at November 1, 1965, at 11.9 million bushels, were about 0.6 million bushels greater than in 1964 but below peak holdings in 1963 by a like amount. Year-end carryover amounted to 7.3 million bushels compared with 6.8 million last year and to a five-year average of 6.5 million bushels.




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


