



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


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STOCKS OF FOOD COMMODITIES IN COLD STORAGE AND OTHER WAREHOUSES

1966

SUMMARY

Total factory butter production during 1966 amounted to 339.1 million pounds, about 2.9 million pounds below production in 1965 and 26.6 million pounds below the record output in 1962. The net decrease in stocks of creamery butter was about 14.3 million pounds — from 75.3 million pounds at January 1, 1966, to 61.0 million pounds at January 1, 1967. However, the combined stocks of all butter and butter oil (the latter expressed as butter equivalent) declined 14.8 million pounds, from 76.1 to 61.3. This compares with a net decrease in combined stocks of 24.1 million pounds in 1965, and the fourth successive year in which stocks have declined since 1958. The lowest volume of combined stocks, butter and butter oil during the year was 34.2 million pounds at April 1, compared with 62.7 million at the same date in 1965, while the highest level was 86.9 million pounds at October 1, compared with 109.4 million at the corresponding date a year earlier. High domestic disappearance coupled with a decline in creamery butter production and depletion of government butter oil stocks resulted in a net reduction of stocks in 1966.

Stocks of cheddar cheese were above year-earlier levels for all months of 1966. The net increase for the year was 14.4 million pounds, up from 65.5 to a record 79.9 million pounds. This was 20.4 million pounds above the 1962-66 five-year average of 59.4 million pounds at January 1. Cheddar cheese production increased to 167.3 million pounds in 1966, the highest since 1945 and the sixth highest production-year on record. Total domestic disappearance of cheddar cheese, including that used in processing was slightly below the record level in 1965, while exports were the highest since 1950.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk during 1966 ranged from a low of 13.2 million pounds at March 1 to 56.1 million, the season's high, at October 1. Stocks of 39.8 million pounds at the beginning of the year were 5.5 million pounds below the 1961-65 five-year average but the build-up of stocks during the year was normal and the year-end carryover rose to 41.0 million pounds, a net increase of 1.2 million for the year.

Skim milk powder stocks amounting to 25.5 million pounds at the beginning of the year declined to 18.1 million at April 1, then rose steadily to 83.5 million pounds at October 1, before dropping off to almost record year-end holdings of 56.1 million at January 1, 1967. Record production and a drop in exports sales more than offset record consumption of skim milk powder during 1966. As a result, the net increase in stocks was 30.6 million pounds for the year.

Month to month egg production trends continue to be quite uniform with peak-season production less conspicuous than formerly. Volume of shell eggs carried in storage during 1966 fluctuated within the narrow range of 49,000 cases to 74,000 cases, indicating uniform clearance of egg supplies with only a moderate build-up of stocks. Frozen egg holdings amounting to 4.4 million pounds at January 1 dropped to the year's low at 2.7 million pounds at May 1 before reaching peak holdings of 4.7 million at August 1. Year-end holdings amounted to slightly under 2.7 million pounds.

Total poultry meat in storage during each month of 1966 was considerably greater than the 1961-65 five-year average holdings. January 1 stocks amounted to 43.3 million pounds compared to 37.7 million for the five-year average and 41.7 million pounds in 1965. By July 1, stocks had been reduced to 26.2 million pounds (25.0 million, a year earlier). Peak holdings, at December 1, were 86.6 million pounds, almost 14.3 million pounds higher than the 1965 peak at the same date and 18.1 million pounds above the five-year average. Carryover at the year-end was 54.5 million pounds, 11.2 million above that carried over from 1965. The net increase in total year-end stocks was mainly due to the higher carryover of chicken meat, both under 4 pounds and over 4 pounds.

Total stocks of red meat during each month of 1966 were below year earlier levels except for May 1, July 1 and the last two months of the year. Holdings of 88.0 million pounds at January 1 rose to 93.2 million at May 1 before declining to the year's low of 70.0 million pounds at October 1. Peak holdings of 98.9 million pounds were reached two months later at December 1. Stocks of pork were higher than a year ago throughout most months of 1966, with year-end holdings at 30.6 million pounds compared to 24.5 million last year and 29.3 million in 1964. Beef holdings were higher during the first seven months of 1966, but fell below year-earlier levels for the remainder of the year, while stocks of veal in 1966 were consistently below year-earlier levels. Combined, the net out-of-storage movement during 1966 was 6.4 million pounds.

Peak holdings of apples at November 1, 1966, at 12.3 million bushels, were about 0.5 million bushels greater than in 1965 but slightly below peak holdings in 1963. Year-end carryover amounted to 7.9 million bushels compared with 7.3 million last year and to a five-year average (1962-66) of 7.0 million bushels.


MONTHLY NET STORAGE MOVEMENT OF PERISHABLE FOOD COMMODITIES












STOCKS OF CREAMERY BUTTER, CHEESE, EGGS AND POULTRY
