



# STOCKS OF FOOD COMMODITIES IN COLD STORAGE AND OTHER WAREHOUSES

1968

## SUMMARY

Total factory butter production during 1968 amounted to 341.1 million pounds, about 5.9 million pounds above production in 1967 but 24.6 million pounds under the record output in 1962. Except for December 1, stocks of creamery butter were below year-earlier levels at all reporting dates in 1968. The net increase in stocks was about 6.2 million pounds, from 56.3 million pounds at January 1, 1968, to 62.5 million pounds at January 1, 1969. May 1 holdings of creamery butter, at 17.8 million pounds, were the lowest since May 1, 1952, when the level dropped to 17.1 million pounds. Peak holdings amounted to 75.0 million pounds at November 1, compared to 80.5 million pounds at the corresponding date a year earlier. Despite slightly increased supplies in 1968, total domestic disappearance of creamery butter continued to decline and the per capita rate of consumption dropped one-half pound.

Stocks of cheddar cheese reached record levels during the first ten months of 1968, then dropped below year-earlier levels for the remainder of the year. The net decrease for the year was 5.7 million pounds, down from 88.6 to 82.9 million pounds. However, this was 12.6 million pounds above the 1964-68 five-year average of 70.3 million pounds at January 1. Cheddar cheese production advanced to 165.8 million pounds in 1968, the second highest production since 1945. Domestic disappearance of cheddar cheese, including that used for processing, reached a new record high in total consumption, but was second to 1967 in per capita rate. Exports, at 42.3 million pounds, were the highest since 1950.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk during 1968 ranged from a low of 13.7 million pounds at March 1 to 49.1 million pounds, the season's high, at September 1. Stocks of 32.0 million pounds at the beginning of the year were 7.9 million pounds below the 1963-67 five-year average but the build-up of stocks during the year was normal and the year-end carryover rose to 35.8 million pounds, a net increase of 3.8 million for the year.

Skim milk powder stocks continued to accumulate to unprecedented levels during 1968. Stocks holdings of 137.5 million pounds at the beginning of the year increased to a record high of 241.7 million pounds by September 1, then dropped to 210.6 million pounds at January 1, 1969. Record production was offset somewhat by record exports

and near record consumption of skim milk powder during 1968. However, the net increase in stocks was 73.1 million pounds for the year.

Despite increased egg production over each month of 1967, except December, there was practically no build-up in stocks of shell eggs during 1968 and average monthly holdings dropped below 1967 levels for most of the year. Storage supplies fluctuated within the narrow range of 96,000 cases at February 1 and 75,000 cases at September 1. Frozen egg holdings amounting to 7.6 million pounds at January 1 declined to 6.6 million at May 1 before reaching peak holdings of 8.7 million pounds at August 1. Year-end holdings amounted to approximately 5.0 million pounds.

Total poultry meat in storage during each month of 1968 was considerably greater than the 1963-67 five-year average holdings. January 1 stocks amounted to 55.8 million pounds compared to 43.5 million for the five-year average and 55.7 million pounds in 1967. By July 1, stocks were reduced to 37.3 million pounds, compared to 48.9 million at the same date a year earlier. Peak holdings, at December 1, were 87.2 million pounds, only 0.7 million pounds below the 1967 peak at the same date but 9.5 million pounds above the five-year average. Carryover at the year-end was 53.3 million pounds, 2.5 million lower than the carryover at the end of 1967. The net decrease in total year-end stocks was mainly due to a smaller carryover of fowl.

Total stocks of red meat during each month of 1968 were below year-earlier levels for all months. Holdings of 93.9 million pounds at January 1 rose to 106.7 million at May 1, the year's peak, before declining to the year's low of 80.9 million pounds at September 1. Carryover at the year-end was 86.1 million pounds. Except for the first four months of the year, stocks of pork products were below year-earlier levels for all months of 1968, with year-end holdings at 25.9 million pounds compared to 34.4 million last year and 31.1 million in 1966. Beef holdings were lower than year-earlier levels in all months of 1968, however, stocks of veal were consistently higher than year-earlier levels.

Peak holdings of apples at November 1, 1968, at 11.0 million bushels, were 1.6 million bushels lower than record peak holdings in 1967 at the same date. Year-end carryover amounted to 7.8 million bushels compared to 8.4 million bushels last year and to a five-year average (1964-68) of 7.7 million bushels.
