SUMMARY

Creamery butter.—The 1970 monthly butter stocks were considerably higher than in 1969. In fact, they were the highest during the past five years. The stocks of creamery butter follow the production pattern of butter by a lag of three to four months. Following the peak production during June, the peak storage holdings occurred during October and amounted to 118,429,000 pounds. This amount was 14,384,000 pounds or 14 per cent more than the October 1969 holdings. The five-year average holdings for October amounted to 93,532,000 pounds.

As creamery butter production decreases during the winter months stocks rapidly diminish and usually a trough or low period occurs during April or May. For 1970 this low occurred during April, and amounted to 66,058,000 pounds. The five-year average holding at the low period was 35,503,000 pounds. During 1970, creamery butter production was down by about 6 per cent and the per capita consumption remained, virtually, the same.

Cheddar cheese.—The monthly holdings of cheddar cheese were considerably below those of the corresponding months of the previous year. In fact, during the past three years, the stocks have been declining. The average monthly stocks for 1968, 1969 and 1970 were 85, 80 and 71 million pounds, respectively. This movement out-of-storage was not due to production changes but rather due to an increase in the consumption of cheddar cheese.

Concentrated milk products.—Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated whole milk showed less variation than in previous years. The peak holdings during 1970 occurred in January, which was probably due to the relatively high build-up of stocks in the fall of the previous year. The 1970 fall build-up was lower than the average of the past five years. The build-up during September amounted to 41 million pounds compared to a five-year average of 49 million pounds for the corresponding month. The usual pattern of the trough in the stock occurs during March, April or May. The 1970 holdings during these months averaged 25 million pounds, compared with the five-year average of 19 million pounds.

Skim milk powder.—The 1970 stocks of skim milk powder were well below those of 1969. The net decrease, based on the January stocks amounted to 68 million pounds. On the average the 1970 stocks were 63 per cent of the 1969 stocks. The 1970 production of skim milk powder was 92 per cent of the 1969 production. The 1970 exports were 125 per cent of the 1969 exports. However, the domestic disappearance

during 1970 was 62 per cent of that for 1969. The relative volume of exports to that of domestic disappearance made exports the main factor for the substantial decrease in stocks of skim milk powder.

Eggs.—The stocks of frozen eggs increased considerably during 1970. The average monthly holdings for 1970, at 5.4 million pounds, were up by 1.0 million pounds compared with 1969. The stocks since January at 2.9 million pounds increased to 8.1 million pounds in October. The net increase based on the January stocks amounted to 4.6 million pounds.

Meat.—The build-up of poultry meat stocks during the latter part of 1970 exceeded that of 1969 and was the highest since 1960. This build-up usually starts in August and reaches a climax in December. Since the beginning of September only frozen poultry meat was reported, however, total stocks have been increasing above previous years' levels. Average stocks during December from 1960-65 amounted to 65 million pounds, compared with the average of 1966-70 of 92 million pounds.

Total stocks of red meat were generally above 1969 levels. Monthly variations are less significant in comparison with the other individual red meat products. Stocks of frozen meat products have been building up since 1965. Annual average monthly stocks in 1965 and 1970 were 54 and 87 million pounds, respectively.

Frozen pork stocks usually reach a peak during the early summer months, i.e. April, May, June and July. Average holdings for 1969 during this period were 25 million pounds, compared with 28 million pounds during 1970 for the comparable period. Fall stocks remained relatively high, resulting in a net increase of 13 million pounds based on the January to January holdings.

Frozen beef stocks were up considerably compared to previous years. The five-year average stock holdings of frozen beef were 30 million pounds. The 1970 average holdings were well above this, at 45 million pounds. The large carryover during November and December of 1969 seem to be reflected throughout in the 1970 stocks.

Apples.—Stocks of apples reached their highest level in November. The 1970 November stocks, at 546 million pounds, were up from the November 1969 level of 539 million pounds, as well as slightly above the five-year average of 532 million pounds.
