

NOTE. - The statistics published in this statement include only the statistics of manufacturing establishments whose principal products are canned fruits and vegetables; jams, jellies, evaporated fruits; marmalades, etc.; pickles, catsups, sauces and vinegar. Statistics relating to specific products are therefore not to be regarded as being the total production in Canada since some of the products of this industry are also produced in the "miscellaneous food", "slaughtering and meatpacking", "coffee, tea and spices" and "flavouring extracts" industries.

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THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1936.

The development of the canned foods industry has affected great changes in the relation of foods to seasons. Fruits and vegetables of many kinds are to be had at all times of the year, not always with all the flavour of the freshly gathered products, but with much of their original freshness and flavour. The producers in the country are provided with an enormously extended market for their products and the consumers in both city and country with cheap and wholesome food in great variety. This industry has made rapid strides during the past few years.

The number of plants in operation increased from 298 in 1935 to 304 in 1936, and the capital investment increased from \$38,272,379 to \$41,572,514. The average number of employees per annum increased from 7,912 to 9,258, salaries and wages increased from \$5,063,481 to \$6,066,761, the value of production increased from \$38,276,487 to \$47,337,397 and the amount paid for materials increased from \$22,252,826 to \$27,455,449. During the period 1923-36 the volume of fruit and vegetable preparations produced increased over 200 per cent. This growth is indeed remarkable as it represents a corresponding increase in the domestic demand for these products, the foreign trade being relatively small when compared with the domestic production. The industry, besides supplying the domestic market, also has a small exportable surplus.

The fruit and vegetable preparations industry includes establishments engaged in canning, evaporating and preserving fruits and vegetables, and also those manufacturing vinegar, cider, pickles, catsup, sauces, etc. The most important branch of this industry is the canning of fruits and vegetables which is carried on most extensively in Ontario, British Columbia and Quebec where climatic conditions for the growing of fruits and vegetables are favourable. The principal fruits canned in Ontario are: apples, pears, plums, peaches, cherries, rhubarb, raspberries and strawberries. In addition, British Columbia has the apricot and loganberry. The vegetables canned include: tomatoes, peas, corn, beans, beets, carrots, pumpkin, spinach and asparagus. The canning season begins in June and continues throughout the summer and autumn until October, being at its height in September. In September of 1936 there were 21,539 wage earners employed in this industry, while in March, the month of lowest employment, there were only 2,923 employed.

In 1936 the physical volume of production was 20 per cent higher than that of the previous year, and the value was 23.6 per cent higher. Of the main items of production, canned fruits increased by 226,464 cases, canned vegetables increased by 809,126 cases, canned soups increased by 979,696 cases, catsups and sauces increased by 1,052,781 gallons, and jams, jellies and marmalades increased by 4,273,939 pounds.

The tables which follow give detailed statistics of production, capital invested, materials used, employment, imports and exports, etc.

THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1936.

Classification according to the main product of the factory shows that there were 170 canning factories, 16 evaporating plants, 73 plants whose principal products were jams, jellies, marmalades, etc., and 45 plants making vinegar, pickles, etc. The following table shows comparative figures for 1935 and 1936 by provinces.

^xThe apparent increase in employment for these years is due to a change in the method of computing the average annual employment of wage-earners. From 1925 to 1930 the average was obtained by summing the averages of the individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation, and not by dividing by twelve the sum of the monthly employment. For example, if a plant operated only during three months of the year with an employment of 100 persons the first month, 125 the second month and 75 the third month, its average annual employment was taken as 100 (300 divided by 3), while in other years the average was taken as 25, (300 divided by 12).

THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1936.

The Department of Municipal Affairs, Trade and Commerce of the Province of Quebec collects statistics on the domestic pack of fruits and vegetables, i.e., canned fruits and vegetables packed elsewhere than in factories. The table below gives the statistics of the domestic pack of canned fruits and vegetables in the Province of Quebec in 1935 and 1936. It should be noted that these figures are not included in any of the tables of this report, and are shown here in order to give a more comprehensive picture of the industry. Similar figures for Ontario are shown in table 9(b).

THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1936.

The quantity and cost value delivered at the factory of the classes of fuel used in this industry during 1936 is shown in table 14. Compared with the preceding year the total cost of fuel rose from \$478,145 in 1935 to \$550,515 in 1936, an increase of \$72,370. Bituminous coal was the principal fuel used and represented 83 per cent of the total cost of all fuels. Coke was the next principal fuel on cost basis, followed in order by wood and anthracite coal. The cost of electricity used amounted to \$116,011.

Imports

Imports of canned fruits and vegetables, jams and jellies, vinegar, pickles and sauces and other fruit and vegetable preparations were valued at \$3,444,665 in 1936, an increase of \$791,704 as compared with the previous year. Canned fruits to the value of \$1,337,577 was the most important item of importation; this was followed by dried fruits \$500,542, jams, jellies, etc. valued at \$433,678, pickles and sauces valued at \$354,867, and canned vegetables valued at \$318,568. Details of the imports are given in table 15 which follows.
