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



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THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1941

The development of the canned foods industry has effected a great change in the relation of foods to seasons. Fruits and vegetables of many kinds are to be had at all times of the year, not always with all the flavour of the freshly gathered products, but with much of their original freshness and flavour. The producers in the country are provided with an enormously extended market for their products and the consumers in both city and country with cheap and wholesome food in great variety.

The number of plants in operation increased from 367 in 1940 to 377 in 1941, and the capital investment from \$49,753,245 to \$55,236,370. The average number of employees per annum increased from 10,474 to 11,943, salaries and wages from \$7,343,982 to \$10,185,116, the value of production from \$55,179,352 to \$75,598,310, and the amount paid for materials from \$33,478,166 to \$45,421,597. During the past decade the volume of fruit and vegetable preparations produced increased over 100 per cent. This growth is indeed remarkable and represents a substantial increase in the domestic demand for these products. The industry, besides supplying the domestic market, also has a substantial exportable surplus.

The statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of establishments engaged in canning, evaporating, preserving and freezing of fruits and vegetables and the manufacture of vinegar, cider, pickles, catsups, etc. Statistics relating to specific products are not to be regarded as the total production for Canada, since many products, such as peanut butter, jelly powders, etc., are also found as secondary products of other industries. For the total production reference should be made to the alphabetical list of products appearing in the report "The Manufacturing Industries of Canada" published annually.

The most important branch of this industry is the canning of fruits and vegetables which is carried on most extensively in Ontario, British Columbia and Quebec where climatic conditions for the growing of fruits and vegetables are favourable. The canning season begins in June and continues throughout the summer and autumn until October, being at its height in September. In September of 1941, there were 25,324 wage-earners employed in this industry, while in March, the month of lowest employment, there were only 4,487 employed.

In 1941 the physical volume of production for the industry as a whole was 23 per cent higher than that of the previous year, while the dollar value of the output advanced by 37 per cent. With the exception of canned fruits which declined by 8 per cent in 1941, all other main items of production were substantially higher. There were increases in the volume of production of canned vegetables, canned soups, jams, jellies and marmalades, catsup and sauces, and pickles and relishes.

The tables that follow give detailed statistics of production, capital invested, materials used, employment, etc.

x The apparent increase in employment for these years is due to a change in the method of computing the average annual employment of wage-earners. From 1925 to 1930 the average was obtained by summing the averages of the individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operations, and not by dividing by twelve the sum of the monthly employment. For example, if a plant operated only during three months of the year with an employment of 100 persons for the first month, 125 the second month and 75 the third month, its average annual employment was taken as 100 (300 divided by 3), while in other years the average was taken as 25, (300 divided by 12).
