THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY, 1952

From a very modest beginning just before the turn of the century, commercialized canning has developed into an industry which is now firmly rooted in every province of this Dominion. The Fruit and Vegetable Preparations Industry, in addition to providing an annual outlet for enormous quantities of agricultural products, has succeeded in marketing an extensive and varied range of wholesome appetizing foods. After slightly more than fifty years of operation, the urban or rural consumers may select their favourite brand in a choice of several grades and sizes to meet their immediate need. In addition to the Canadian market, the industry annually exports large quantities of its products to foreign ports, notably Great Britain and the United States.

In 1952 this industry reached an all-time high with a total value of production of \$211,787,559 as against the previous high of \$200,779,150 which was attained in 1951. During the decade immediately preceding the war the volume of fruit and vegetable preparations produced increased over 54%. In spite of curtailment of supplies during the war years the production trend continued upward. In 1949 there was a slight falling off, due partly to the large carryover of these commodities and partly to economic conditions. From 1951 to 1952 the number of plants in operation increased from 459 to 462. The average number of employees decreased from 16,401 to 16,020, with an increase in salaries and wages from \$30,107,576 to \$31,992,856. Cost of materials used increased from \$116,052,675 to \$120,602,514.

The statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of establishments engaged in canning, evaporating, preserving and freezing of fruits and vegetables and the manufacture of vinegar, cider, pickles, catsups, etc. Statistics relating to specific products are not to be regarded as the total production for Canada, since many products, such as peanut butter, jelly powders, etc., are also found as secondary products of other industries. For the total production, reference should be made to the alphabetical list of products appearing in the report "The Manufacturing Industries of Canada" published annually.

The most important branch of this industry is the canning of fruits and vegetables which is carried on most extensively in Ontario, British Columbia and Quebec where climatic conditions for the growing of fruits and vegetables are most favourable. The canning season begins in June and continues throughout the summer and autumn until October, being at its height in September. In September of 1952 there were 30,543 wage-earners employed in this industry, while in March, the month of lowest employment, there were only 6,482 employed.

In 1952 the gross value of production of the industry increased over 5 per cent, while the volume of production increased only 2.8 per cent. There was an increase of 2.8 per cent in the volume of canned soups, 12.5 per cent in canned vegetables, 9.1 per cent in jams, jellies and marmalades, and 15.6 per cent in pickles. At the same time a decrease of 24.6 per cent in canned fruits and 13.5 per cent in catsups was experienced.

The tables following give detailed statistics of products made, materials used, employment, salaries and wages paid, imports and exports, etc.
