THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY, 1956

From a very modest beginning just before the turn of the century, commercialized canning has developed into an industry which is now firmly rooted in every province of this Dominion. The Fruit and Vegetable Preparations Industry, in addition to providing an annual outlet for enormous quantities of agricultural products, has succeeded in marketing an extensive and varied range of wholesome appetizing foods. After slightly more than fifty years of operation, the urban or rural consumers may select their favourite brand in a choice of several grades and sizes to meet their immediate need. In addition to the Canadian market, the industry annually exports large quantities of its products to foreign countries, notably Great Britain and the United States.

In 1952, the Bureau changed its policy with regard to the collection of statistics on the production of manufactured goods. Firms in several industries, where year-end inventory changes were known to be insignificant, were requested to report value of shipments f.o.b. plant instead of gross value of production. However, this new concept was not adopted in the Fruit and Vegetable Preparations Industry until 1954. Therefore, statistics in this issue relating specifically to the years 1954 to 1956 are on a shipments basis while data for 1953 and previous years are on a selling value of products basis.

Also beginning in 1954 figures on Inventory Values have been collected (See Table 6). By adding the change in finished goods inventory (as in 1955) for finished goods plus goods in process (as in 1956) to the value of shipments it is possible to obtain a value of production figure which is comparable to preceding years. In Table 1 is a column on "value added by manufacture". This is computed by subtracting cost of materials, fuel and electricity from value of production.

In 1956 the total value of factory shipments was \$249,883,547, an increase of approximately \$15 million from \$234,075,326 reported in 1955. During the decade immediately preceding the war, the volume of fruit and vegetable preparations produced increased over 54 per cent. In spite of curtailment of supplies during the war years the production trend continued upward. In 1949 there was a slight fall-off due partly to a large carryover of these commodities and partly to economic conditions. From 1955 to 1956 the number of operating plants decreased from 459 to 446 employees from 17,151 to 16,750 but salaries and wages increased from \$38,939,576 to \$39,969,038.

The statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of establishments engaged in canning, evaporating, preserving and freezing of fruits and vegetables and the manufacture of vinegar, cider, pickles, catsups, etc. Statistics relating to specific commodities are not to be regarded as the total shipments for Canada, since many products, such as peanut butter, jelly powders, etc., are also found as secondary products of other industries. For the total shipments of individual commodities, reference should be made to the alphabetical list of commodities appearing in the report "The Manufacturing Industries of Canada" published annually.

The most important branch of this industry is the canning of fruits and vegetables which is carried on most extensively in Ontario, British Columbia and Quebec where climatic conditions for the growing of fruits and vegetables are most favourable. The canning season begins in June and continues throughout the summer and autumn until October being at its height in August and September. In September of 1956 there were 28,629 wage earners employed in this industry, while in February, the month of lowest employment, there were 7,327 persons employed. In 1956 the gross value of shipments of the industry increased 6.7 per cent. Volume shipments showed increases for jams, jellies, and marmalades of .8%, soups 3.3%, catsups 11.4%, pickles 15.2%, infants foods 4.5%, while decreases were recorded for canned fruits 5%, canned vegetables 3%, frozen fruits and vegetables 7%. Other detailed statistics will be found in the following tables for such items as selling value of shipments, materials used, employment, salaries and wages paid, imports and exports, etc.
