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# THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY, 1957

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## NOTICE

# THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY, 1957

From a very modest beginning just before the turn of the century, commercialized canning has developed into an industry which is now firmly rooted in every province of this Dominion. The Fruit and Vegetable Preparations Industry, in addition to providing an annual outlet for enormous quantities of agricultural products, has succeeded in marketing an extensive and varied range of wholesome appetizing foods. After slightly more than fifty years of operation, the urban or rural consumers may select their favourite brand in a choice of several grades and sizes to meet their immediate need. In addition to the Canadian market, the industry annually exports large quantities of its products to foreign countries, notably Great Britain and the United States.

In 1957 the total value of factory shipments was \$265,469,913, an increase of approximately \$15.5 million from \$249,883,547 reported in 1956. During the decade immediately preceding the war, the volume of fruit and vegetable preparations produced increased over 54 per cent. In spite of curtailment of supplies during the war years the production trend continued upward. In 1949 there was a slight fall-off due partly to a large carryover of these commodities and partly to economic conditions. From 1956 to 1957 the number of operating plants decreased from 446 to 430, employees increased from 16,750 to 17,742 salaries and wages increased from \$39,969,038 to \$43,711,739.

The statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of establishments engaged in canning, evaporating, preserving and freezing of fruits and vegetables and the manufacture of vinegar, cider, pickles, catsups, etc. Statistics relating to specific commodities are not to be regarded as the total shipments for Canada, since many products, such as peanut butter, jelly powders, etc., are also found as secondary products of other industries. For the total shipments of individual commodities, reference should be made to the alphabetical list of commodities appearing in the report "The Manufacturing Industries of Canada" published annually.

The most important branch of this industry is the canning of fruits and vegetables which is carried on most extensively in Ontario, British Columbia and Quebec where climatic conditions for the growing of fruits and vegetables are most favourable. The canning season begins in June and continues throughout the summer and autumn until October being at its height in August and September. Number of employees engaged in the industry ranged between a high of 30,773 in September and a low of 7,397 in March. In 1957, the gross value of shipments of the industry increased 6%. Increased volumes of shipments were recorded for the following groups: canned fruits, 4.8%; canned vegetables, 3.1%; canned soups 14.7%; catsups, 12.3%; infants foods, 16.0%; frozen fruit and vegetables, 31.8% and pickles, 21.4%. Decreased volumes were registered as follows: jams, jellies and marmalades, 3.2% and tomato juice 2.6%. Detailed data on shipments; materials used; employment; salaries and wages and imports and exports will be found in the following pages.

In 1953 and previous years, the industry was on a production basis. "Value added by manufacture" was computed by subtracting the cost of raw materials and of fuel and electricity from value of production.

In 1954, value of factory shipments replaced value of production and opening and closing inventory valuations were collected for the first time. For 1954 and 1955 value of production was computed by using the value of shipments plus or minus the change in finished goods inventories. For 1956 and 1957 the change in goods in process inventory was also taken into account. When value of production was thus determined, value added by manufacture was arrived at by subtracting cost of raw materials and of fuel and electricity. The following table on Principal statistics for the period 1951-1957 inclusive illustrates this procedure.
