

THE MACARONI AND VERMICELLI INDUSTRY IN CANADA

1920.

Ottawa, March, 1923. The Dominion Bureau of Statistics presents herewith a report on the Magaroni industry in Canada for the calendar year 1920. The number of concerns reporting was 10, distributed by provinces as follows: Alberta, 1; Manitoba, 2; Ontario, 4; and Quebec 3.

PRINCIPAL STATISTICS

The principal statistics of the industry are shown as far as permissible by provinces in table (1). The Bureau does not give out individual statistics. This is done by limiting the number of concerns to be compiled in any industry to three, whether in a town or city, a province or the Dominion. The value of production in 1920 amounted to \$1,523,613 for a quantity of 12,955,416 pounds. A summary of production by quantities and value since 1917 shows the following: in 1917 the quantity was 8,183,080 pounds valued at \$1,006,750, in 1918 it rose to 11,209,886 pounds valued at \$1,213,732, in 1919 there was a decrease in the value of production, the figures being 11,375,109 pounds and the value \$1,152,652, while in 1920 the production was as stated above. The value added by manufacture was \$446,161, or 29.3 per cent of the value of production, to which the wages of labour contributed \$212,150 or 47.5 per cent, fuel and miscellaneous expenses \$203,877, or 45.7 per cent, there remaining 6.8 per cent or \$30,134 from which to pay dividends and defray all other charges not included under miscellaneous expenses.

THE MACARONI AND VERMICELLI INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1920.

PRODUCTION

The production of Macaroni and vermicelli, etc. is shown in table (2) by quantity and selling value at the factory, for each of the provinces and the Dominion. The value in 1920 exceeded that of any previous years by about \$300,000, while, measured by quantity of production, the increase amounted to 1,560,307 pounds when compared with the previous high total of 1919.

CAPITAL

The amount of capital employed in the industry is given by items and provinces in table (3). There was an increase in Capital over 1919 of \$359.563, to which Land, buildings and fixtures contributed \$120,233; Machinery and tools, \$93,172; Materials on hand, stocks in process, etc., \$124,480 and working capital \$21,678.

EMPLOYEES, SALARIES & WAGES

The number of persons employed during the year is shown by classes of employment, sex and salary and wage payments in table (4). There was an increase of 46 in the number employed over 1919 and in salaries and wages paid of \$46,984, when the totals were 234 in the number of employees and \$165,166 in the amount of salaries and wages.

MATERIALS USED

The quantity and cost value of all materials delivered at the works during the year is shown in table (6) by provinces, the total value in 1920 being \$1,077,452, as compared with \$657,942 in 1919.

FUEL CONSUMPTION

The quantity and cost value at the factory of the classes of fuel consumed during the year is shown in table (7), and amounted to \$21,713 of which \$4,079 was of Canadian origin and \$17,634 of foreign origin.
