THE MACARONI AND VERMICELLI INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1926.

Ottawa. October, 1927. A report is herewith presented on the production of macaroni and vermicelli in Canada during the calendar year 1926. The number of establishments reporting rose from 9 in 1923 to 11 in 1924, 1925 and 1926 which were located by provinces as follows:— Ontario 4, Quebec 3, Manitoba 2, Alberta 1, British Columbia 1. In order to prevent disclosure of information concerning individual establishments, statistics for the last 3 provinces have been combined and are shown, throughout this report under the head of Western provinces. A summary of the principal statistics of the industry is given in Table 1 compared for the calendar years 1925 and 1926.



Production

The quantity and value of macaroni, vermicelli etc. produced during the calendar years 1925 and 1926 is given by provinces in Table II. There was an increase in both the quantity produced and the selling value of the product. In 1925 the amount was reported at 14,723,598 pounds valued at \$1,250,949. During the period covered by this report the quantity rose to 18,686,966 pounds worth \$1,493,403, an increase of 3,963,368 pounds and \$242,454 in selling value.

Capital Investment

The capital employed in the industry during the calendar year 1926 is given by provinces in Table III. The total capitalization fell from \$1,292,049 in 1925 to \$1,286,097 in 1926, a decrease of \$5.952. Of the total capitalization the province of Quebec contributed \$819,320 being 65.3 per cent of the total capital investment of the Dominion.

Employees, Salaries and Wages

The number of persons employed in the industry during the calendar year 1926 is given in Table IV by (a) classes of employment, (b) sex and (c) salary and wage payments. The total number of employees rose from 261 in 1925 to 317 in 1926, an increase of 56, and the payroll rose from \$224,478 in 1925 to \$250,469 in 1926 or an increase of \$25,991.



Other Employment Statistics

The number of days the establishments were in operation during the calendar year 1926 together with the number of hours per day and per week normally worked by wage-earners, is shown in Table V(a). The number of wage-earners employed during the same period are given by sex and by menths in Table V(b). Employment reached the peak in October when 284 persons were on the payrell and the least number reported was 122 in the menth of May.

Materials Used

The cost of all materials used in the industry during the calendar year 1925 rose from \$712,711 in 1924 to \$795,203 in 1925 and to \$960,373 in 1926, an increase of \$82,492 in 1925 and \$165,170 in 1926. Of the total expenditure for all materials used Quebec accounted for \$581,627 or 60.5 per cent. Manufacturers of macaroni were not required to furnish information relating to either kind of quantity of materials used during 1925. Statistics for 1926 are given in the summary table following.



Fuel Consumption

The quantity and cost of all fuel consumed in the industry during the calendar year 1926 is given in Table VI. Fuel costs rose from \$10,173 in 1925 to \$10,917 in 1926, an increase of \$744. Anthracite coal was the principal item of fuel reported followed by bituminous coal, whilst gas, artificial ranks third in importance.

Power Installation

The power employed in the industry during the calendar year 1926 is given in Table VII. The only class of power reported was electric motors operated by purchased power, whose total rose from 131 units with 820 horse power capacity in 1924 to 133 units developing 825 horse power in 1925 and to 163 units with 847 horse power in 1926 or an increase in 1926 of 30 units and 27 horse power.
