

### THE MACARONI AND KINDRED PRODUCTS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931.

The production of macaroni, vermicelli, spaghetti, etc., in Canada in 1931 although greater in volume was nevertheless lower in value. The output in this industry amounted to 20,311,423 pounds valued at \$1,195,987 as compared with an output of 16,819,625 pounds valued at \$1,246,147 in 1930. In addition to the macaroni, etc., produced in this industry, there is also about 1,000,000 pounds produced in the biscuit industry.

The fourteen establishments comprising this industry were distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario four. British Columbia four, Quebec three, Manitoba two and Alberta one. These plants reported in 1931 a capital investment of \$1,847,708, an average employment of 233 persons who received \$173,493 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$580,032 for materials and produced goods valued at \$1,135,987.

Imports of macaroni, vermicelli, etc., decreased from 2,968,506 pounds valued at \$225,691 in 1930 to 1,294,649 pounds valued at \$91,171 in 1931. Exports, however, were higher. In 1931 they amounted to 1,149,934 pounds valued at \$55,911 as compared with 731,842 pounds valued at \$54,076 the previous year.

The tables that follow give detailed statistics of production, capital, employment, materials used, imports and exports, etc.
