THE MACARONI AND KINDRED PRODUCTS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1937.

The production of macaroni, spaghetti, vermicelli, noodles, etc., in this industry in 1937 amounted to 34,297,721 pounds with a selling value at the factory of \$1,857,692. Compared with 1936 when the output was 35,949,325 pounds valued at \$1,752,668 there was a decrease of 1,651,604 pounds in the quantity but an increase of \$105,024 in value.

In addition to the macaroni, etc., produced in this industry 2,311,970 pounds were also produced in other industries in 1937 making a total production of 36,609,691 pounds as compared with 37,703,889 pounds in the previous year.

There were fifteen establishments comprising this industry in 1937. These were distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario four, British Columbia four, Quebec three, Manitoba three and Alberta one. In 1937 these fifteen plants reported a capital investment of \$2,152,651, an average employment of 331 persons who received a total of \$280,352 in salaries and wages, they spent \$1,184,874 for materials and produced goods valued at the factory at \$1,863,044.

Imports of macaroni, vermicelli, etc., increased from 384,823 pounds valued at \$29,264 in 1936 to 622,389 pounds valued at \$47,607 in 1937. Exports were less in quantity but higher in value. In 1937 they amounted to 6,241,815 pounds valued at \$348,206 as compared with 6,735,710 pounds valued at \$344,286 the previous year.

The tables which follow give detailed statistics of production, capital, employment, materials used, imports and exports.
