ESTIMATES OF PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION OF MEATS, 1949

Ottawa, April 8, 1950: Estimates of meat production and consumption are based on data obtained from live stock surveys, export and import reports, and reports of marketings and slaughter of live stock in Canada. The estimates for 1949 include the Province of Newfoundland.

Total production of meats (excluding offals) from live stock slaughtered in Canada in 1949, together with estimated meat equivalent of animals exported alive was 2,131 million pounds, a decrease of 5 per cent from the 1948 production of 2,235 million pounds. Beef production decreased 5 per cent, veal 11 per cent, mutton and lamb 9 per cent, and pork 3 per cent. Exports of all kinds of live animals except calves were lower than in 1948, and the output of meats from Canadian slaughter was lower generally. The total estimated output of meats and edible offals from animals slaughtered in Canada in 1949 was 2,031 million pounds as compared with 2,113 million pounds in 1948.

Decreased production was reflected in sharply reduced exports of all meats except offals. The most significant decline was in exports of pork which decreased by 153 million pounds. Total exports of all meats on a dressed-carcass basis amounted to 206 million pounds which was a little less than half the previous year's export of 418 million pounds. Exports of beef and veal decreased by 21 per cent, mutton and lamb by 23 per cent, pork by 67 per cent and canned meats by 69 per cent.

Consumption of meats per capita was 139.2 pounds in 1949 as compared with 134.5 pounds in 1948. Per capita consumption in 1949, by kinds of meats, 1948 figures in brackets, was as follows: beef 56.5 (57.5) pounds; veal 9.1 (10.9) pounds; mutton and lamb 3.0 (3.5) pounds; pork 59.3 (53.9) pounds; offals 5.6 (6.0) pounds; and canned meats 5.7 (2.7) pounds.
