## ESTIMATES OF PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION OF MEATS, 1953

Canadians ate more beef, veal and mutton and lamb but less pork per person in 1953 than in 1952. Supply-price relationships, with pork in shorter supply and higher in price than during 1952 and the opposite situation for beef. resulted in this expression of consumer preference at the meat counter. Consumption per capita by kinds of meat during 1953 and 1952 (1952 figures in brackets) was: beef, 59.1 lb. (44.7); veal, 9.1 lb. (6.7); mutton and lamb, 2.3 lb. (1.9); pork, 57.0 lb. (65.9); offal, 5.2 lb. (5.5); canned meats, 7.4 lb. (8.2); total, all meats, 140.1 lb. (132.9).

Total meat production, less offal but including estimated meat equivalent of animals exported alive, decreased about 1 per cent to 2,021 million pounds in 1953 as compared with 2,040 million pounds in 1952. Meat and edible offal output from animals slaughtered in Canada amounted to 2,068 million pounds in 1953 as compared with 2,116 million pounds in 1952, the peak output of 2,729 million pounds in 1944, and a 1935-39 annual average production of 1,481 million pounds.

Expressed in terms of dressed weight, exports of beef and veal decreased to 28.9 million pounds in 1953 as compared with 68.1 million pounds in 1952 while exports of pork were 55.3 million pounds and of canned meats 30.3 million pounds as compared with 15.0 and 19.8 million pounds, respectively, in 1952.

These estimates of meat production and consumption are based on information derived from the Dominion Bureau of Statistics' semi-annual live-stock surveys, reports of storage stocks of meats, foreign trade, etc., and on marketing and inspected slaughter data reported by the Canada Department of Agriculture.
