## ESTIMATES OF PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION OF MEATS, 1954

Per capita consumption of meats in Canada was about 4 pounds greater in 1954 than in 1953. Consumption of beef, veal and lamb increased while that of pork and canned meats was lower. Consumption per capita by kinds of meat during 1953 and 1954 (1953 figures in brackets) was: beef, 72.0 lb. (64.5); veal, 10.1 lb. (8.2); mutton and lamb, 2.5 lb. (2.3); pork 53.7 lb. (55.0); offal, 5.3 lb. (5.1); canned meats, 2.8 lb. (7.2); total, all meats, 146.4 lb. (142.3).

Total meat production, less offal but including estimated meat equivalent of animals exported alive, increased about 9 per cent to 2,247 million pounds in 1954 as compared with 2,059 million pounds in 1953. Meat and edible offal output from all farm and commercial slaughter in Canada amounted to 2,290 million pounds in 1954 as compared with 2,104 million pounds in 1953, the peak output of 2,729 million pounds in 1944, and a 1935-39 annual average output of 1,481 million pounds.

Meat exports, in terms of dressed weight, were 31 per cent greater in 1954 than in 1953, at 159 as compared with 121 million pounds. Exports of canned meats at 66.8 million pounds were more than double the 1953 quantity and pork product exports increased by 5.3 million pounds while beef and veal exports were 6.3 million pounds lower than in 1953.

These estimates are based on information derived from the Dominion Bureau of Statistics' semi-annual live-stock surveys, reports of storage stocks of meats, foreign trade, etc., and on marketing and inspected slaughter data reported by the Canada Department of Agriculture. Revisions of 1952 and 1953 data arise largely from slight changes in conversion factors as established during the past year after study by an inter-departmental committee.
