ESTIMATES OF PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION OF MEATS, 1955

In 1955, per capita consumption of meat in Canada increased 3.5 pounds, from 148.0 pounds in 1954 to 151.5 pounds. This increase was brought about by heavier consumption of pork while that of beef remained steady. Consumption of mutton and lamb, and offal rose slightly while that of veal showed a decrease. Consumption per capita (in cold dressed carcass equivalent), by kinds of meat, during 1955 and 1954 (latter in brackets) was: beef, 72.0 lb. (72.0); veal, 8.8 lb. (10.1); mutton and lamb, 2.8 lb. (2.5); pork, 58.0 lb. (53.7); offal, 5.7 lb. (5.3); canned meats, 4.2 lb. (4.4); total, all meats, 151.5 lb. (148.0).

Total meat production, less offal but including estimated meat equivalent of animals exported alive, increased over 5 per cent to 2,365 million pounds in 1955 as compared to 2,249 million pounds in 1954. Meat and edible offal output from farm and commercial slaughter in Canada amounted to 2,427 million pounds in 1955 as compared to 2,292 million pounds in 1954 and the 1935-39 annual average output of 1,481 million pounds.

Meat exports, in terms of dressed weight, amounted to 104.1 million pounds in 1955, a drop of 18 per cent from 1954 exports. Beef and canned meats exports were little more than half the quantities exported in 1954 while exports of pork products - the major item in meat exports - increased from 60.6 million pounds in 1954 to 64.1 in 1955.

These estimates are based on information derived from the Dominion Bureau of Statistics' semi-annual farm livestock surveys, from reports of storage stocks of meats, foreign trade, and on marketing and inspected slaughter data reported by the Canada Department of Agriculture. Revisions of 1953 and 1954 data arise largely from correcting for the lage in reporting 1953 exports of canned meat products.


