ESTIMATES OF PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION OF MEATS. 1958

The disappearance of red meats in Canada during 1958 decreased 4.5 pounds per capita from 142.6 pounds in 1957 to 138.1 pounds (cold dressed carcass equivalent). This decrease occurred despite a rise of 5.6 pounds per person in the apparent consumption of pork, estimated at 51.8 pounds compared to 46.2 pounds in 1957. It is directly attributable to a 10.0 pound per capita decrease in the disappearance of beef, estimated at 64.8 pounds compared to the all-time high of 74.8 pounds in 1957. This reflects the rising price of beef in 1958 in the wake of the flow of slaughter and feeder cattle to the United States. It also reflects the increasing supply of pork in the second half of 1958 which made a partial substitution of pork for beef possible to Canadian consumers. Per capita disappearance of other red meats in 1958, with 1957 comparisons in brackets were: veal, 8.8 pounds (9.0); mutton and lamb, 2.7 pounds (2.7); offal (or fancy meats), 4.8 pounds (5.3); and canned meats, 5.2 pounds (4.6).

The meat equivalent of livestock output from Canadian farms increased 7.4 per cent in 1958 relative to that in 1957, or from 2,503,976,000 pounds to 2,690,416,000 pounds. This output includes animals of Canadian origin slaughtered in Canada plus the meat equivalent of live animals exported if the latter had been raised to market weight in Canada.

Output of meats and offal from livestock slaughtered in Canada, including commercial, farm, and other kill, amounted to 2,453,248,000 pounds, an increase of 1.7 per cent over the 1957 output. Of the total, beef accounted for 1,163,595,000 pounds and pork 1,012,739,000 pounds.

Exports of each of the major red meats increased in 1958. The total quantity shipped out of the country was 148,295,000 pounds in 1958, 39.6 per cent above the 1957 total. However, the volume is still considerably below the 1946-50 average of 376,602,000 pounds in total.
