Per capita consumption of the red meats in Canada in 1962 amounted to 138.5 pounds. little changed from the revised estimate of 138.8 pounds for 1961 but about 5 pounds per capita less than consumption in 1960. The domestic disappearance per person in 1962 by kinds of meat was: beef, 69.9 pounds (69.7 in 1961); veal, 6.5 (6.8); mutton and lamb, 3.8 (3.6); pork, 49.9 (49.9); offal or 'fancy meats', 4.2 (4.5); canned meats on a dressed meat equivalent basis, 4.2 (4.3). Domestic disappearance of lard was estimated at 8.0 pounds per capita in 1962 as compared to 8.4 pounds in 1961.

Production of meat from livestock slaughtered in Canada during 1962 amounted to about 2,535 million pounds, a slight increase from the revised estimate of 2,523 million pounds produced in 1961. Very moderate increases took place in beef and pork production but output of veal and of mutton and lamb from domestic slaughter was lower than in 1961. Fewer cattle but more calves were exported alive during 1962 than in 1961. Exports of beef dropped off almost 10 million pounds to 27.7 million and pork exports decreased from 52.4 million pounds in 1961 to 47.9 million in 1962, but with moderately greater exports of 'fancy' meats and canned meat products than in 1961 the total of all meat exports was almost the same. Total import volume of meat products was near 130 million pounds in each of the last two years. Increased imports of beef and mutton and lamb in 1962 offset reductions in imports of pork and canned meats.

Annual estimates of meat production and disappearance involve the use and analysis of data from various sources, among which are the semi-annual farm livestock inventory and production estimates which are revised to conform with Census benchmark data as these become available after each Census. Revisions to the historical series of estimates for the 1956 to 1961 intercensal period are included in this report. Fairly substantial exports of live cattle and calves were an important feature during this period. Some of the revision in the estimates of beef and veal production results from classifying part of the live cattle exports in the trade class '200 to 700 pounds' as calves. In the earlier estimates the total number of animals in this trade class had been treated as cattle. The use of slightly modified conversion factors also contributed to some of the changes from the preliminary estimates.
