ESTIMATES OF PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION OF MEATS 1963L BRARY

With a significant increase of 4.5 pounds in beef consumption the per capita disappearance of the red meats rose to 143.6 pounds in 1963 from 137.9 pounds in 1962. Increased imports of pork and mutton and lamb kept the level of consumption of these meats slightly above last year. Disappearance per person in 1963 by kinds of meat, with corresponding figures for 1962 in brackets, was: beef, 73.8 pounds, (69.3); veal, 6.6 pounds, (6.5); pork, 50.7 pounds, (49.8); mutton and lamb, 4.1 pounds, (3.9); canned meats on a dressed meat equivalent basis, 4.4 pounds, (4.2); offal or 'fancy meats', 4.0 pounds, (4.2). Per capita disappearance of lard was 7.6 pounds, down 5 per cent from 8.0 pounds in 1962.

Meat production from livestock slaughtered in Canada during 1963, including inspected slaughter and other commercial and farm kill, is estimated at 2.645 million pounds. This is a 4.5 per cent increase from 2.525 million pounds in 1962. Fewer cattle and calves were amported alive but production of beef and veal from animals slaughtered in Canada rose 8.6 and 5.3 per cent, respectively. Pork production was practically unchanged but mutton and lamb production, including live animals imported for slaughter, was 4.4 per cent lower than in 1962.

Farm output of meat, including a meat equivalent for animals exported alive, is estimated at 2,646 million pounds, up 2.2 per cent from 1962. In this context beef production increased almost 5 per cent while yeal was 6.3 per cent and mutton and lamb 9.8 per cent lower than in 1962. Pork production was almost the same.

Exports of meat (cold, dressed carcass basis) rose 6.5 per cent to 123.8 million pounds from 116.2 million in 1962. Substantial increases in exports of canned meats and offal were partially offset by decreased export of beef and pork. A feature of Canada's foreign trade in meats in 1963 was pork imports of 88.3 million pounds compared to 35.6 million pounds in 1962. Imports of mutton and lamb, canned meats, and offal also increased significantly. Lard imports, on the other hand, decreased by about 31 per cent.
