
INTRODUCTION

ESTABLISHMENTS.- There were 76 slaughtering and meat packing plants in operation in Canada in 1927, distributed by provinces as follows: Prince Edward Island, 1; Nova Scotia, 1; New Brunswick, 10; Quebec, 19; Ontario, 23; Manitoba, 7; Alberta, 6; Saskatchewan, 3; and British Columbia, 6. New Brunswick, Ontario and Manitoba each show an increase of 1 in the number of establishments in operation - a total increase of 3 for the Dominion.

PRODUCTION.- The total value of production of the slaughtering and meat packing industry in 1927 was \$167,220,892, an increase over the preceding year of \$93,801, and an increase over the year 1925 of \$3,404,082. Increases are shown in the quantities of all kinds of meats sold fresh, and of poultry, with corresponding increases in value. The quantity of beef sold fresh was 371,907,314 lb., an increase over the preceding year of 10,076,244 lb., or 2½ p.c. The quantity of pork sold fresh was 129,985,452 lb., an increase of 18,588,666 lb., or 16 p.c. Mutton and lamb sold fresh showed an increase of nearly 2 million lb., veal an increase of 6 million lb., and poultry an increase of 1 million lb. The selling price per lb. for beef in 1927 was 11½ cents, an increase of ½ cent over the preceding year; the price of mutton and lamb 20½ cents, a decrease of 1 cent; the price of pork 17 cents, a decrease of 2 cents; and the price of veal 13 cents, an increase of ½ cent per lb. Cured meats showed decreases in quantity sold for all items excepting salted or cured beef. The production of hams dropped from 30 million lb. in 1926 to 22 million lb. in 1927; shoulders from 23 million lb. to 8 million lb., and bacon and sides from 72 million lb. to 69 million lb. The production of sausage shows an increase of about 1 million lb. The total quantity of lard, lard compound and other shortening made in 1927 was 95,483,982 lb., compared with 102,003,536 lb. in 1926. The following tables show (1) the total value of production for the years 1917 to 1927, and (2) itemized production for the years 1925, 1926 and 1927.





THE SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY, CANADA

CAPITAL.- The capital investment of the industry shows an increase of nearly five million dollars over the preceding year. The total value of capital in 1927 was \$60,612,029, compared with \$55,712,724 in 1926. These totals comprise values of land, buildings and machinery, materials and supplies on hand, and cash and operating accounts. The average value of capital per establishment was \$797,526, compared with \$763,188 in 1926.

TIME IN OPERATION AND HOURS OF WORK.- The total number of days in operation by all plants during the year was 22,185, or an average of 291.9 days per plant, compared with a total of 21,045 days and an average per plant of 288 days in 1926. The average number of hours worked per day by wage-earners was 8.8 in both years, while the average number of hours worked per week was 50.8 in 1927 and 51.2 in 1926. The classification of wage-earners according to number of hours worked per day shows 3,831 persons in the group of those working 8 hours per day or less, 3,193 in the group of those working 9 hours, 2,022 working 10 hours, and 737 working over 10 hours.

EMPLOYEES AND SALARIES AND WAGES.- The number of persons employed during the year was 11,048, compared with 10,685 in 1926, while the salaries and wages paid amounted to \$14,551,250 in 1927 and \$13,757,638 in the preceding year. The number of persons classified as salaried employees was 2,845, an increase of 4 over the preceding year, while the salaries totalled \$5,113,402, a decrease of \$4,746. The number of wage-earners increased from 7,844 in 1926 to 8,203 in 1927, and the amount paid in wages from \$8,639,490 to \$9,437,848. Statistics of monthly employment of wage-earners in the industry show November with 9,200 employees as the month of highest employment, and April with 7,607 employees as the month of lowest employment.

FUEL USED.- The chief items of fuel were coal with a value of \$767,289, and electricity with a value of \$365,911. The total value of all fuel used during the year was \$1,247,504, compared with \$1,321,206 in 1926.

POWER EQUIPMENT.- Nearly all of the power used was furnished by electric motors and steam engines and turbines. The electric motors numbered 1,850, with a total rated capacity of 27,839 h.p., and the steam engines and turbines 64, with a capacity of 6,951. There were also 4 gasoline engines with a capacity of 72 h.p., and 133 boilers of 18,696 h.p.


ANIMALS SLAUGHTERED AND MATERIALS USED.- The total cost value of animals slaughtered was \$112,239,020, compared with \$112,043,450 in the preceding year. The decrease in value is due to the drop of $3\frac{1}{2}$ cents per lb. in the price of hogs, although this was partly balanced by an increase of $2\frac{1}{2}$ cents per lb. in the price of beeves. The number and weight of animals slaughtered were greater in the preceding year for all kinds of animals. The number of beeves slaughtered was 752,364, an increase of 59,074; the number of hogs, 2,821,234, an increase of 139,929; the number of sheep and lambs, 621,805, and increase of 77,914; and the number of calves, 628,640, an increase of 294,242. The total number of all animals slaughtered in the plants during the year was 4,824,043, compared with 4,252,884 in 1926. The average cost value per lb. of beeves slaughtered was $11\frac{1}{2}$ cents, compared with 9 cents in 1926, and the average cost of hogs, $13\frac{1}{2}$ cents, compared with 17 cents. Prices of sheep and lambs and of calves were $21\frac{1}{2}$ cents and 12 cents respectively in 1927, with about the same prices in the preceding year. The value of dressed meat purchased fresh or partially cured was \$7,303,521, of poultry, \$2,288,445, and of miscellaneous materials, including vegetable and animal oils, salt, sugar, containers, etc., \$11,245,375, making a total value for animals slaughtered and materials used of \$133,076,361, compared with \$139,200,096 in 1926.

IMPORTS AND EXPORTS.- The total value of products of the Canadian slaughtering and meat packing industry exported during the year 1927 was \$39,790,271, compared with \$42,188,480 in 1926. The value of products of the same kind imported in 1927 was \$20,937,796, compared with \$19,382,716 in the preceding year.
