

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

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# SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1921-33

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THE SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY, CANADA, 1933.

The slaughtering and meat packing industry is one of the most important of the Canadian manufacturing industries. In 1932, the latest year for which complete statistics of all industries are available, it stood third on the list of the forty leading industries in order of gross value of output, and first in order of cost value of materials used. For value of capital, number of employees, and salaries and wages paid, its ranking is much lower.

Production.- The decline in value of output which commenced in 1930, was arrested in 1933, when the value showed an increase over 1932 of a million dollars, the totals for the two years being as follows: \$92,366,137 in 1933, and \$91,246,523 in 1932. The principal item affecting the increase in production was that of "bacon and sides", which showed an increase of 52 per cent in quantity and 49 per cent in value. It might be noted here that the trade tables of exports in 1933 show for the item of "bacon and hams, shoulders and sides" an increase over 1932 of 105 per cent in quantity and of 122 per cent in value. Among the different kinds of meats sold fresh, beef and veal showed increases in quantity, but decreases in value, while for mutton and lamb and pork, decreases in both quantity and value are recorded. Average prices were lower than in 1932 for all kinds of fresh meats excepting pork, which recorded a slight increase. Among the cured meats, higher prices are shown for salted pork, hams and shoulders, and lower prices for salted beef and bacon and sides. Important increases are noted in the prices of hides and skins, as well as in the prices of tankage, bones and fertilizers.

In Table I, which follows, will be found the total value of products sold in each of the years 1921 to 1933, while Table II gives the quantity and value of the different items of production in the years 1931 to 1933, with average prices in the two latter years.

Establishments.- The number of slaughtering and meat packing plants in operation in 1933 was 135, this total including a few small plants which were engaged in slaughtering only. Although the average value of production per plant in this industry in 1933 was \$684,194, only 59 of the plants had a value of over \$100,000, the remaining 76 plants being included in the group of those with production value of less than \$100,000.

Capital.- The capital investment of the industry in 1933 had a total value of \$54,590,398, apportioned as follows: Land, buildings and machinery, \$35,005,037; materials, products and supplies on hand, \$11,317,848; and cash and accounts and bills receivable, \$8,267,513. Compared with the preceding year the total value shows an increase of \$1,362,469, or 2½ per cent.

Employees and Salaries and Wages.- The total number of persons employed during the year was 9,289, compared with 9,101 in 1932, and the salary and wage bill was \$10,103,744, compared with \$10,349,315. The salaried employees in 1933 numbered 2,017, with salaries of \$3,316,957, and the wage-earners, 7,272 with wages of \$6,786,787, the number of wage-earners showing an increase over 1932 of 190 but a decrease in wages of \$107,130, or 1½ per cent, while the number of salaried employees shows a decrease of 2 and the salaries a decrease of \$138,441, or 4 per cent.

Animals Slaughtered and Materials Used.- Increases over 1932 are recorded in the slaughtering of each of the several kinds of animals, beeves showing an increase of 65,051, sheep and lambs of 82,108, hogs of 8,962, and calves of 63,178. Higher prices per pound were paid in 1933 than in 1932 for sheep and lambs and hogs, and lower prices for beeves and calves. In the following table will be found the numbers of the different kinds of animals slaughtered in the years 1921 to 1933.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports.- The value of exports of the Canadian slaughtering and meat packing industry was nearly double that of the preceding year, amounting to \$15,084,096, compared with \$8,387,707 in 1932. The principal item in both years was "bacon and hams, shoulders and sides", with a value of \$3,796,871 in 1932 and \$8,423,710 in 1933. Other items recording increases in value are canned meats, soups and hides and skins.

Imports.- The value of imports of products of the industry was \$6,095,246, an increase over the preceding year of \$1,320,156. The principal items in order of value in 1933 were hides and skins, "grease, rough, the refuse of animal fat, for the manufacture of soap and oils only", sausage casings, and "gelatine, n.o.p., and isinglass.

CONSUMPTION OF MEATS

The following statement, prepared by the Agricultural Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, shows the estimated consumption of meats in Canada in 1932 and 1933.
