



# SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1921-34

THE SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY, CANADA, 1934.

Among the forty leading industries of Canada in 1934, that of slaughtering and meat packing takes fourth place in order of value of production, being preceded by the pulp and paper, central electric stations and non-ferrous metal smelting groups.

The slaughtering and meat packing industry is centred chiefly in Ontario, where the value of products sold during the year represented 42 per cent of the total for Canada. The position held by each of the other provinces in relation to total value is shown by the following percentages: Quebec, 19 per cent, Manitoba, 16 per cent; Alberta, 11 per cent; British Columbia, 6 per cent; Saskatchewan, 5 per cent; and Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick combined, 1 per cent.

The industry in 1934 shows a remarkable advance over the low years 1932 and 1933, when the value of production had dropped, for the first time in many years, below the hundred million dollar mark. In 1934 the total value of products sold amounted to \$122,112,406, an increase over 1933 of \$29,746,269, or 32 per cent, over 1932 of \$30,865,883, or 34 per cent, and over 1931 of \$4,515,709, or 4 per cent. The meats sold fresh included 404,748,679 pounds of beef, 138,864,486 pounds of pork, 54,334,456 pounds of veal, and 37,974,109 pounds of mutton and lamb. Among the cured meats, the combined production of bacon and sides was 93,117,762 pounds, ham 31,397,184 pounds, and salted pork 53,182,131 pounds. Other items of importance in the industry are sausage, shortening and lard. Most of the principal items of production show increases in quantity, and all show increases in value. Average prices were higher for practically all items. Beef sold fresh advanced from 6.7 cents per pound in 1933 to 6.9 cents in 1934, pork from 8.9 cents to 12 cents, veal from 7.6 cents to 8.2 cents, and mutton and lamb from 10.8 cents to 11.8 cents. Among the cured meats, the average for bacon and sides rose from 13.5 cents to 19.1 cents, and for hams from 13.8 cents to 18.6 cents.

Establishments. - The number of plants in operation during the year 1934 was 147, including a few small establishments engaged in slaughtering only. A classification of the plants according to value of production shows that 80 had a product value of less than \$100,000; 31 a value of \$100,000 to under \$500,000; 9 a value of \$500,000 to under \$1,000,000 and 27 a value of \$1,000,000 and over.

Animals Slaughtered and Materials Used. - The total number of animals slaughtered during the year was 5,229,009, and the dressed weight was 940,714,059 pounds, compared with a total of 5,075,211 animals and a dressed weight of 861,295,449 pounds in 1933. The total cost value of all animals slaughtered and of materials used was \$98,417,162, compared with \$70,467,544 in 1933. The following table shows the numbers of the different kinds of animals slaughtered in the years 1923 to 1934, while in table 7, pages 16 to 19, will be found detailed statistics of slaughterings and of the various kinds of materials used in the preparation of products of the meat packing industry - oils of different kinds, sugar, salt, spices, etc., in the year 1934.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports. - Exports of products of the Canadian slaughtering and meat packing industry have more than trebled during the period 1932 to 1934, the total for the year under review amounting to \$26,458,449, compared with \$8,387,707 in 1932. The total for 1933 was \$15,084,096. The principal item of export in each of the three years is that classified as "bacon and hams, shoulders and sides", the value in 1934 amounting to \$18,952,628, or 72 per cent of the total exports of the industry.

Imports. - The value of imports of meat and meat products in 1934 was \$6,689,702, compared with \$6,095,246 in 1933. Hides and skins, sausage casings and gelatine are the items of chief importance.

CONSUMPTION OF MEATS

The following statement, prepared by the Agricultural Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, shows the estimated consumption of meats in Canada in 1933 and 1934. (This statement is based on estimates of the number of animals sold off or killed on farms, and the imports and exports.)


