

THE SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY.

CANADA, 1940

The greatly increased output of the slaughtering and meat packing industry in 1940 sent the total value of production to \$228,500,487 from \$185,196,133 in 1939. Meats sold fresh had a total value of \$96,631,817, an increase over the preceding year of 13.5 per cent; meats cured, cooked and canned, a value of \$102,493,427, an increase of 43.7 per cent; lard and shortening, a value of \$12,823,535, a decrease of 9.0 per cent; hides and skins, a value of \$7,239,869, an increase of 16.5 per cent; and miscellaneous items (tallow, oils, grease, etc.) a value of \$9,311,839, an increase of 10.6 per cent, making a total increase for all products of 23.4 per cent.

Particular attention is centred at the present time on pork products: the quantity of pork sold fresh in 1940 increased over that of the preceding year by 18.5 per cent; salted pork increased by 95.2 per cent; hams by 16.8 per cent; shoulders by 14.9 per cent; and bacon and sides by 71.2 per cent. The total value of pork sold fresh and cured was \$103,316,638, compared with \$72,986,188 in 1939.

Little change from the preceding year is shown in average prices. Among the meats sold fresh, beef and mutton and lamb were each a cent per pound higher, but pork dropped a cent. In the cured products, the price of hams was stationary, while the price of shoulders was a cent a pound less and the price of bacon and sides dropped one-half a cent.

The number of plants in operation in 1940 was 146, distributed by provinces as follows: Prince Edward Island, 2; Nova Scotia, 4; New Brunswick, 5; Quebec, 28; Ontario, 64; Manitoba, 10; Saskatchewan, 8; Alberta, 13; and British Columbia, 12. Compared with the preceding year the total number shows a decrease of 4.

In order of value of output, Ontario is first, while Quebec and Manitoba are second and third respectively. The relation which the product of each province bears to the total value for the Dominion is shown by percentage as follows: Ontario, 40.2; Quebec, 18.1; Manitoba, 16.5; Alberta, 13.7; British Columbia, 5.7; Saskatchewan, 4.5; and the provinces of Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, combined, 1.3.

Note: For most industries the questionnaire of the Census of Industry asks for information concerning the quantity and value of goods manufactured during the year, whether sold or not. This procedure is departed from in the case of the slaughtering and meat packing industry and the inquiry concerning production deals with the sale of the product. The inquiry is thus expressed at the suggestion of the Industrial and Development Council of Canadian Meat Packers, as it is believed that the information can be supplied in this form with greater convenience and accuracy.

THE SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY, CANADA

The annual census of the industry aims to include only those establishments which dispose of their product at wholesale: small local butchers whose slaughtering furnish the main supply for their own shops and whose business is entirely of a retail nature are excluded.

In table 1, which follows, will be found the principal statistics of the slaughtering and meat packing industry, in the years 1924 to 1940, while table 2 gives, for the years 1938 to 1940, the items of production, by quantity and value.

- (a) In 1931 there were added to the Bureau's list of slaughtering and meat packing plants a number of small establishments engaged in slaughtering only, and annual reports from these plants have since been included in the compilation of returns of the industry. The addition of these small plants, however, does not affect materially the value of production of the industry, as the combined value of their output would represent not more than four per cent of the total for all plants.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports.— The value of exports of meats and meat products during the year was \$70,085,222, an increase over the year 1939 of \$25,784,843, or 58 per cent. Chief amongst the exports is the item "bacon and hams, shoulders and sides", which jumped from 1,878,251 cwt., valued at \$32,656,049 in 1939 to 3,456,042 cwt., valued at \$58,814,151 in 1940. Hides and skins constitute an important group with a total export value of \$3,681,084.

Imports.— Meat and meat products were imported into Canada for consumption in 1940, to the value of \$26,993,937, an increase over the preceding year of \$9,191,819, or 52 per cent. The main items of import are: wool in the grease and washed or scoured, valued at \$11,879,748; hides and skins at \$6,180,839; pork, fresh, chilled or frozen at \$3,247,211; and sausage casings at \$1,166,651.
