



## THE SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING 1950

The value of output of the slaughtering and meat packing industry in 1950 reached an all-time peak at \$757,043,355, an increase of 8.4 p. c. over the 1949 figure of \$697,950,039. Reeves and sheep and lambs showed a considerable decline in numbers killed during the year while an increased slaughter of hogs and calves brought the total slaughtering to 2.3 p. c. above the previous year. The cost value of the animals slaughtered was \$522,492,556, an increase of 8.7 p. c. over the 1949 figure and the total cost of all materials used at \$645,353,830 was 10.1 p. c. higher than in the previous year.

Employment was afforded to 20,522 persons a slight decrease of 64, but the salary and wage total of \$54,532,037 was an increase of 4.6 p. c. over the 1949 figure.

The products of the industry may be conveniently grouped into four main divisions—fresh and frozen meat, including poultry, which accounted for \$416,059,412 or 55.0 p. c., of the total sales; cured meats including cooked meats and fresh sausage, which accounted for \$217,790,559, or 28.8 p. c.; lard and shortening, for \$51,103,786, or 6.7 p. c.; hides and skins, for \$23,355,353, or 3.1 p. c.; and miscellaneous products for \$48,734,245, or 6.4 p. c.

The most important single item was fresh and frozen beef with 588,998,263 lb., valued at \$240,744,746. This was a decrease of 13.3 p. c. in volume and an increase of 5.6 p. c. in value. The second item in order of volume and value was fresh and frozen pork, with 276,890,329 lb. valued at \$101,921,231. The value rose by 16.4 p. c. and the quantity by 13.4 p. c. in comparison with 1949. The third place was taken by bacon and sides, with 108,684,286 lb. valued at \$48,938,753, a decrease of 6.9 p. c. in volume and of 12.8 p. c. in value. Shortening was the fourth item in order of value, with 131,067,124 lb. valued at \$36,423,850, an increase of 4.7 p. c. in volume and 10.9 in value, as compared with 1949.

The position occupied by each province in relation to the total value of production for Canada was as follows: Atlantic Provinces, 2.2 p. c.; Quebec, 23.1 p. c.; Ontario, 38.7 p. c.; Manitoba, 13.7 p. c.; Saskatchewan, 4.2 p. c.; Alberta, 11.4 p. c. and British Columbia, 6.7 p. c.

Note: For most industries the questionnaire of the Census of Industry asks for information concerning the quantity and value of goods manufactured during the year, whether sold or not. This procedure is departed from in the case of the slaughtering and meat packing industry and the inquiry concerning production deals with the sale of the product. The inquiry is thus expressed at the suggestion of the Industrial and Development Council of Canadian Meat Packers, as it is believed that the information can be supplied in this form with greater convenience and accuracy.

**Animals Slaughtered and Materials Used** — The combined value of all items under this classification was \$645,353,830, made up as follows: Animals, slaughtered, \$524,063,612; dressed meat purchased fresh or partially cured, \$44,356,927; poultry, \$10,440,171; vegetable, fish and animal

oils, \$41,307,954; and miscellaneous materials, \$25,185,166.

**Tankage**

In 1949 the Bureau inaugurated a special study on tankage and products derived therefrom. Owing to the inexperience of some reporters in this subject, it was found necessary to adjust certain discrepancies which appeared in other tables of the bulletin.

In the present report such adjustments have not been necessary because of the better understanding of what was required, by firms reporting.

The considerable difference between the opening inventory on final products shown in this report and the closing inventory which appeared in the 1949 report, is due to a more accurate classification having been made this year by some reporting firms who formerly included 'Closing' inventories under the heading 'sold or otherwise disposed'.

# THE SAUSAGE AND SAUSAGE CASINGS INDUSTRY

## 1950

The statistics in this section relate to the production of those firms specializing in the manufacture of these products. They do not attempt to show the total production of either sausage or casings, by far the greater proportion of which is

made in the slaughtering and meat-packing industry. In addition, it must be remembered that many small butchers and delicatessen operators make sausage and related products for sale in their own retail establishments.

The total value of production of the specialized sausage and sausage casing industry in 1950, at \$13,479,118, was an increase of 21 p.c. over the 1949 figure. The increase was due to higher prices and increased output, as the volume of items for which quantities are recorded rose 9 p.c. every item showing marked increases in both volume and value, except frankfurters which declined slightly in volume but increased in value. The cost of materials was 14 p.c. higher than in the previous year.

The industry, while not conducted on a large scale, is growing; the 77 reporting establishments recording 901 employees, or an average of about 12 persons per plant. In 1949 there were 774 employees in 75 plants.

Salaries and wages amounted to \$1,863,027, an increase of 31 p.c. over the 1949 figure. The number of employees increased by 16 p.c.
