THE COFFEE AND SPICE INDUSTRY 1919.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics has completed a preliminary report on the Coffee and Spice Industry in Canada for the calendar year 1919. The report covers the operations of 39 individual plants located by provinces as to number as follows:- Ontario 15, Quebec 8, British Columbia 6, Manitoba 5, Alberta and New Brunswick 2 each and Nova Scotia 1.
