

THE TOBACCO MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931.

The output of the Tobacco Manufacturing Industry in 1931 was valued at \$74,926,154, which represents a decrease of \$10,745,632 or 12.5 per cent over that of the previous year. Cigarettes formed the main item of production with an output of 4,431,585 thousand valued at \$42,865,121. Smoking tobacco was next in importance with an output of 17,075,006 pounds valued at \$18,883,595. This was followed by cigars with a production of 155,412 thousand valued at \$7,247,152, chewing tobacco 5,200,954 pounds valued at \$4,612,085 and snuff 926,381 pounds valued at \$1,192,309.

The number of establishments engaged in the tobacco industry totalled 105, located by provinces as follows: - Prince Edward Island two, Nova Scotia one, Quebec sixty-two, Ontario twenty-eight, Manitoba one, Alberta two and British Columbia nine. These plants represented a capital investment of \$50,194,202 in fixed and current assets, they furnished employment to 9,091 persons who were paid \$8,096,769 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$21,448,879 for materials and containers and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$74,926,154. Of the establishments reporting in this industry sixty-three made cigars only, twenty-three made tobacco only, nine made tobacco and cigarettes, four made tobacco and cigars, two made snuff only, three made tobacco and snuff and one plant made tobacco, cigars and cigarettes.

Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of \$1,181,913 in the capital invested in spite of an increase of two in the number of establishments. The decrease in the capital invested was, however, due to decreases in the inventories of raw materials and finished products. The value of land, buildings, machinery and tools rose from \$11,158,147 in 1930 to \$12,553,035 in 1931. Although there was a decrease of 10.5 per cent in the volume of production and 12.5 per cent in its value, the number of persons employed increased by 186 and the salaries and wages paid by \$259,058.

The tobacco industry also contributes materially to the agricultural economy of Canada. Of the materials used amounting to \$21,448,879, \$17,286,944 was for raw leaf tobacco. All told, the tobacco industry consumed 33,969,546 pounds of raw leaf tobacco of which 19,006,792 pounds was of domestic origin. For the production of cigars 1,411,469 pounds of imported and 1,493,559 pounds of domestic tobacco were used; for the production of cigarettes 6,402,549 pounds of imported and 4,899,581 pounds of domestic tobacco were required, while for the production of smoking and chewing tobacco and snuff 7,148,736 pounds of imported and 12,613,652 pounds of domestic tobacco were used.

Foreign trade in manufactured tobacco is small compared with the domestic production. In 1931, imports of cigars were valued at \$80,641, cigarettes \$95,118, cut tobacco \$424,025, snuff \$13,116 and all other manufactured tobacco \$161,436. Exports were even smaller. There was, however, an export of 6,697,801 pounds of unmanufactured tobacco valued at \$2,018,802 most of which was shipped to the United Kingdom. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase of 1,331,932 pounds in the quantity of raw tobacco exported.
