THE TOBACCO INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1943.

The tobacco industries in Canada perform two distinct operations, and this report is separated into two sections accordingly. Section I covers the operations of all firms engaged in the manufacture of tobacco, smoking and chewing, snuff, cigars and cigarettes. Section 2 deals with the preliminary operations which consist of the processing and packing of raw leaf tobacco.

SECTION 1. - TOBACCO PRODUCTS

The number of establishments engaged in the tobacco products industry totalled 70, located by provinces as follows: Prince Edward Island 2; Quebec 46; Ontario 17; Manitoba 1 and British Columbia 4. These plants represented a capital investment of \$78,331,842 in fixed and current assets, they furnished employment to 10,805 persons who were paid \$12,084,381 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$31,476,712 for materials and containers, and produced goods with a net selling value at the factory of \$64,091,935. Of the establishments reporting in this industry 33 made cigars only, 16 made tobacco only, 8 made tobacco and cigarettes, 4 made tobacco and cigars, 1 made snuff only, 3 made tobacco and snuff, 1 made tobacco, cigars and cigarettes, 1 made tobacco, cigars and snuff, 2 made cigarettes only and 1 tobacco flavourings.

The net output (selling values less excise duties and taxes) of the tobacco manufacturing industry in 1943 was valued at \$64,091,935 which represents an increase of \$4,701,903 or 7.9 per cent above that of the previous year. The gross output (selling values including excise duties and taxes) was valued at \$206,608,542. Cigarettes formed the main item of production with an output of 13,591,320 thousand valued at \$155,930,531. Smoking tobacco was next in importance with an output of 24,808,718 pounds valued at \$35,536,053. This was followed by cigars with a production of 200,370 thousand valued at \$9,665,753, chewing tobacco 2,927,050 pounds valued at \$3,660,488 and snuff 941,740 pounds valued at \$1,796,435.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$7,121,947 in the capital invested, 303 in the number of employees, \$1,326,669 in the salaries and wages paid, \$2,760,286 in the cost of materials used, and \$4,701,903 in the net value of production.

The tobacco industry also contributes materially to the agricultural economy of Canada. Of the total cost of materials used, amounting to \$31,476,712, \$21,504,332 was spent for domestic raw leaf tobacco. All told, the tobacco industry consumed 68,203,115 pounds of raw leaf tobacco of which 66,930,346 pounds was of domestic origin. For the production of cigars, 794,995 pounds of imported and 3,293,322 pounds of domestic tobacco were used; for the production of cigarettes, 307,915 pounds imported and 37,446,742 pounds of domestic tobacco were required, while for the production of smoking and chewing tobacco and snuff, 169,859 pounds of imported and 26,190,282 pounds of domestic tobacco were used.

The tables following give detailed statistics of production, employment, materials used, capital invested, etc.

SECTION 2. - TOBACCO PROCESSING AND PACKING.

This section of the tobacco industry deals with the primary operations of processing the green raw leaf into a state suitable to undergo the final stage of conversion into the finished article in the form of smoking and chewing tobacco, cigars and cigarettes. During the year 1943 reports were received from fifteen firms, six of which were located in the province of Quebec and nine in Ontario. Principal statistics for this section of the industry, are shown in the following tables.

The amount of raw leaf tobacco processed during the year 1943 was 74,229,925 pounds with a selling value of \$24,245,096 compared with 84,814,236 pounds processed in 1942 with a selling value of \$23,636,018. The principal variety of processed raw leaf was "bright flue-cured" of which 59,161,450 pounds were prepared with a valuation of \$20,683,353. In order of importance "burley" follows with 8,857,172 pounds valued at \$2,192,338. The quantity and selling value of all tobacco processed is shown by kinds for Canada and the provinces in Table 2.
