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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, OCTOBER 1st, 1928

The butter in storage amounts to 28,671,012 pounds of creamery and 714,697 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows an increase of 1.47% over last month and a decrease of 23.28% from last year; while dairy butter shows increases of 22.33% over last month and 4.01% over last year.

Cheese stocks total 27,806,984 pounds in store showing decreases of .18% and 22.26% from last month and last year respectively. Eggs in cold storage amount to 14,998,667 dozen; other than cold storage 602,538 dozen, and frozen eggs 3,111,418 pounds. Cold storage eggs show increases of .36% over last month and 17.11% over last year; eggs, other than cold storage show decreases of 49.95% from last month and 20.60% from last year; while frozen eggs show a decrease of 5.82% from last month and an increase of 116.40% over last year.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 8,070,919 pounds; fresh, not frozen 3,573,290 pounds; cured, dry salted 1,954,683 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 8,049,265 pounds; in process of cure 7,057,750 pounds. Comparative figures show fresh frozen stocks to have decreased 29.21% from last month and increased 20.32% over last year and fresh stocks, not frozen to have increased 10.34% and 40.93% over last month and last year respectively. Cured, dry salted stocks show a decrease of 41.91% from last month and an increase of 60.14% over last year; cured, sweet pickled shows increases of 4.25% over last month and 2.80% over last year; and stocks in process of cure show an increase of 20.27% over last month and a decrease of 13.00% from last year.

The lard in storage amounts to 3,527,254 pounds, showing a decrease of 14.86% from last month and an increase of 17.59% over last year.

Beef stocks total 2,929,551 pounds of fresh frozen; 6,014,050 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 257,929 pounds of cured and 174,045 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 12.65% over last month and a decrease of 37.48% from last year; while fresh stocks not frozen show increases of 20.33% over last month and 1.56% over last year. Cured stocks show decreases of 13.46% from last month and 5.83% from last year; while stocks in process of cure show an increase of .64% over last month and a decrease of 71.22% from last year.

Veal in storage amounts to 812,411 pounds of fresh frozen and 485,704 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Comparative figures show a decrease in fresh frozen stocks of 1.29% from last month and an increase of .55% over last year; while in fresh stocks, not frozen an increase of 30.84% over last month and a decrease of 4.30% from last year is shown.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 715,268 pounds of frozen and 425,930 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show increases of 130.39% over last month and 16.94% over last year; and stocks not frozen show an increase of 45.48% over last month and a decrease of 14.36% from last year.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 248,488 pounds; chickens 201,409 pounds; fowl 354,664 pounds; ducks 84,747 pounds; geese 16,769 pounds; turkeys 314,082 pounds; unclassified 235,682 pounds. Comparative figures show decreases in total poultry of 4.96% and 39.45% from last month and last year respectively.

Fish stocks total 22,932,470 pounds of fresh frozen and 5,226,832 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows increases 13.86% over last month and 6.70% over last year; and other fish in cold storage also shows increase of 3.33% over last month and 3.37% over last year.

During the month of September 4,078,890 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 4,587,967 pounds frozen during the month of August.

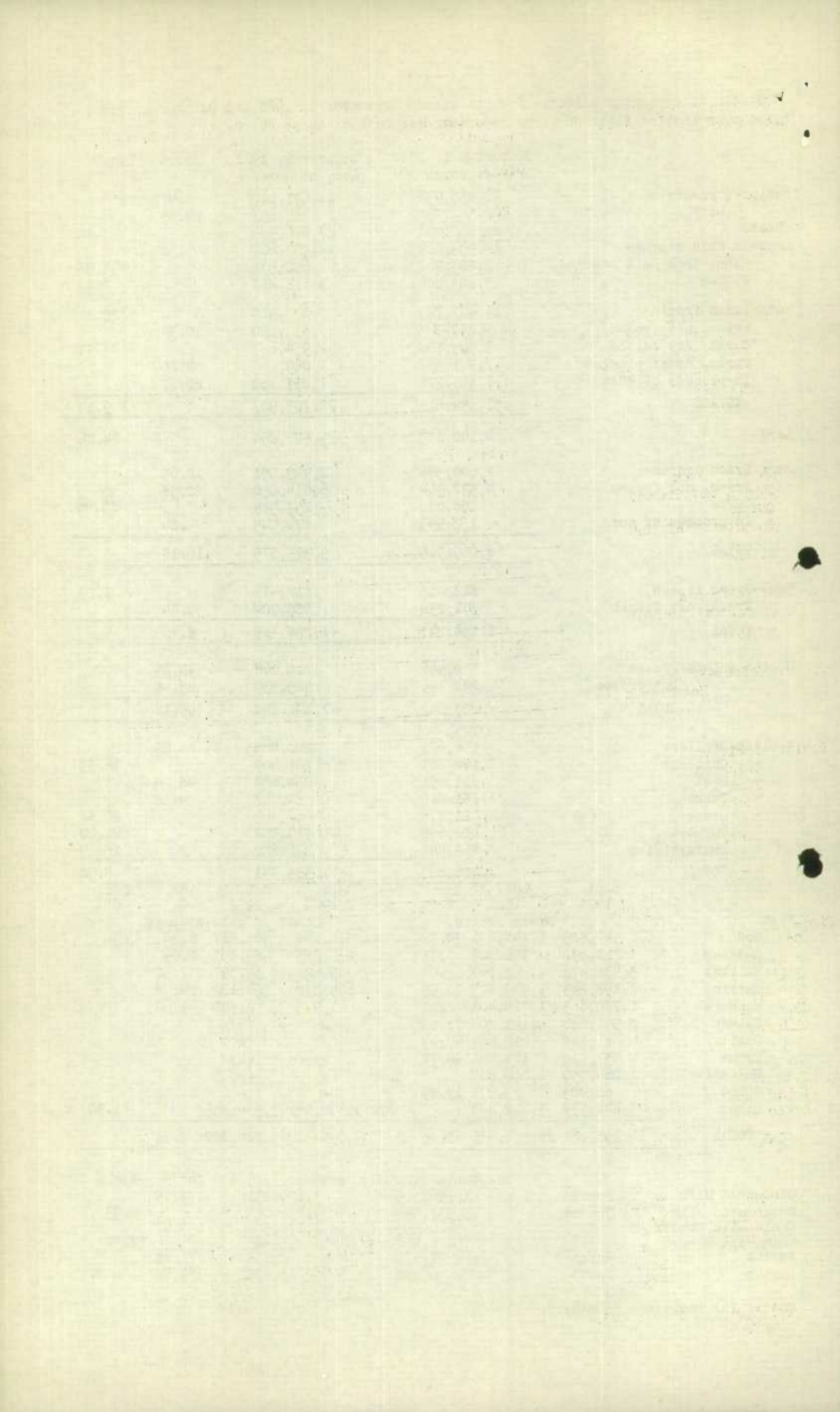
