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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, January 1, 1929.

The butter in storage amounts to 13,421,958 pounds of creamery and 362,403 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 22.00% from last month and 36.66% from last year and dairy butter also shows decreases of 40.05% from last month and 13.76% from last year.

Cheese stocks total 18,460,551 pounds in store showing decreases of 5.48% and 11.44% from last month and last year respectively.

Eggs in storage amount to 2,591,323 dozen; other than cold storage 266,784 dozen; and frozen eggs 2,684,162 pounds. Cold storage eggs show a decrease of 57.38% from last month and an increase of 3.18% over last year; other than cold storage eggs show decreases of 18.56% from last month and 31.26% from last year; and frozen eggs show a decrease of 9.38% from last month and an increase of 139.34% over last year.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 13,548,987 pounds; fresh, not frozen 2,541,995 pounds; cured, dry salted 2,142,654 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 6,253,117 pounds; in process of cure 6,424,390 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 115.57% over last month and a decrease of 9.27% from last year; while fresh stocks, not frozen show a decrease of 32.48% from last month and an increase of 2.34% over last year. Cured, dry salted stocks show a decrease of 5.36% from last month and an increase of 89.14% over last year; cured, sweet pickled stocks show decreases of 5.13% from last month and 28.74% from last year; and stocks, in process of cure show an increase of 13.26% over last month and a decrease of 5.56% from last year.

The lard in storage amounts to 2,748,841 pounds showing increases of 37.31% and 20.83% over last month and last year, respectively.

Beef stocks total 16,237,126 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,697,325 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 169,448 pounds of cured; and 333,403 pounds of beef, in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 22.33% over last month and a decrease of 10.44% from last year, and fresh stocks, not frozen show decreases of 38.52% from last month and 15.32% from last year. Cured stocks show a decrease of 52.16% from last month and an increase of 21.55% over last year; and stocks, in process of cure show increases of 293.34% over last month and 24.13% over last year.


Veal in storage amounts to 1,704,923 pounds of fresh frozen and 121,765 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 1.03% from last month and an increase of 17.34% over last year; while stocks, not frozen show decreases of 50.57% and 52.66% from last month and last year respectively.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 5,729,836 pounds of frozen and 222,218 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 9.06% over last month and a decrease of 4.50% from last year; and not frozen stocks show decreases of 55.27% from last month and 30.18% from last year.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 405,375 pounds; chickens 4,070,830 pounds; fowl 1,556,912 pounds; ducks 155,637 pounds; geese 101,417 pounds, turkeys 1,775,951 pounds, unclassified 1,213,394 pounds. Comparative figures show increases in total poultry of 98.71% and 16.80% over last month and last year respectively.

Fish stocks total 20,210,229 pounds of fresh frozen fish and 7,204,494 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows a decrease of 17.28% from last month and an increase of 12.84% over last year, while other fish in cold storage shows increases of 23.83% over last month and 60.42% over last year.

During the month of December 3,286,263 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 5,326,630 pounds frozen during November.




