COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS

COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, FEBRUARY 1, 1929.

The butter in storage amounts to 10,739,115 pounds of creamery and 390,559 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 19.21% from last month and 42.68% from last year, while dairy butter shows increases of 8.70% over last month and 77.68% over last year.

Cheese stocks total 16,680,676 pounds in store showing decreases of 9.50% and 4.58% from last month and last year respectively.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 1,255,868 dozen; other than cold storage 318,036 dozen; and frozen eggs 2,148,717 pounds. Cold storage eggs show a decrease of 51.01% from last month and an increase of 23.62% over last year; other than cold storage eggs show an increase of 19.21% over last month and a decrease of 1.08% from last year; and frozen eggs show a decrease of 16.48% from last month and an increase of 106.58% over last year.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 17,165,679 pounds, fresh, not frozen 4,704,849 pounds; cured, dry salted 1,218,955 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 6,246,733 pounds; in process of cure 8,205,003 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 28.48% over last month and 7.62% over last year and fresh stocks, not frozen show an increase of 85.17% over last month and a decrease of 33.07% from last year. Cured, dry salted stocks show decreases of 43.09% from last month and 4.26% from last year; cured, sweet pickled stocks also show decreases of .03% from last month and 35.43% from last year; while stocks in process of cure show increases of 27.72% over last month and 11.16% over last year.

The lard in storage amounts to 3,504,995 pounds showing increases of 27.73% and 16.41% over last month and last year respectively.

Beef stocks total 12,548,052 pounds of fresh frozen; 4,678,334 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 235,576 pounds of cured; and 313,852 pounds of stocks in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 19.33% from last month and 9.65% from last year and fresh stocks, not frozen show an increase of 26.85% over last month and a decrease of 16.19% from last year. Cured stocks show increases of 39.03% over last month and 5.21% over last year; and stocks in process of cure show a decrease of 5.86% from last month and an increase of 29.33% over last year.

Veal in storage amounts to 983,724 pounds of fresh frozen and 245,357 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 36.81% from last month and an increase of 11.29% over last year and fresh stocks, not frozen show an increase of 101.50% over last month and a decrease of 12.89% from last year.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 4,362,406 pounds of frozen and 239,540 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show decreases of 23.39% from last month and 14.23% from last year and stocks not frozen show an increase of 7.80% over last month and a decrease of 59.36% from last year.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 404,053 pounds; chickens 3,282,133 pounds; fowl 1,139,086 pounds; ducks 110,562 pounds; geese 68,808 pounds; turkeys 1,481,262 pounds; unclassified 1,259,918 pounds. Total poultry shows a decrease of 13.88% from last month and an increase of 1.97% over last year.

Fish stocks total 15,338,660 pounds of fresh frozen and 6,573,841 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows decreases of 22.73% and 2.30% from last month and last year respectively and other fish in cold storage shows a decrease of 8.73% from last month and an increase of 5.12% over last year.


During the month of January 1,680,264 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 3,286,263 pounds frozen during December.
