COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, MARCH 1, 1929.

The butter in storage amounts to 8,230,536 pounds of creamery and 100,635 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 33.72% from last year and 24.01% from last month, and dairy butter also shows decreases of 37.88% from last year and 74.35% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 14,360,065 pounds in store showing decreases of 7.77% and 14.09% from last year and last month respectively.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 182,203 dozen; other than cold storage 212,106 dozen; and frozen eggs 2,173,291 pounds. Cold storage eggs show decreases of 33.98% from last year and 85.49% from last month; eggs other than cold storage also show decreases of 22.72% from last year and 33.44% from last month; while frozen eggs show an increase of 141.11% over last year and a decrease of 3.04% from last month.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 23,493,086 pounds; fresh not frozen 3,992,853 pounds; cured, dry salted 1,425,422 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 9,006,686 pounds; in process of cure 7,936,068 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 4.84% over last year and 33.29% over last month and fresh stocks, not frozen show an increase of 1.20% over last year and a decrease of 15.46% from last month. Cured, dry salted stocks show increases of 2.42% over last year and 16.94% over last month; cured, sweet pickled stocks show a decrease of 9.88% from last year and an increase of 44.18% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show decreases of 9.90% from last year and 5.47% from last month.

The lard in storage amounts to 4,129,636 pounds showing increases of 6.95% and 17.37% over last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 9,976,614 pounds of fresh frozen; 4,798,092 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 285,331 pounds of cured; and 235,936 pounds of stocks, in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 13.50% from last year and 23.78% from last month and fresh stocks, not frozen show increases of 9.70% over last year and 2.06% over last month. Cured stocks show increases of 136.12% over last year and 21.12% over last month, while stocks in process of cure show decreases of 18.26% and 24.99% from last year and last month respectively.


Veal in storage amounts to 870,841 pounds of fresh frozen and 201,826 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 47.73% over last year and a decrease of 20.46% from last month; and stocks not frozen show decreases of 29.65% from last year and 17.74% from last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 4,032,748 pounds of frozen and 100,907 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show decreases of 1.62% from last year and 10.95% from last month; and stocks not frozen show an increase of 8.45% over last year and a decrease of 57.98% from last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 341,303 pounds; chickens 3,217,169 pounds; fowl 1,024,117 pounds; ducks 91,001 pounds; geese 57,512 pounds; turkeys 1,632,473 pounds; unclassified 1,226,847 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of 4.12% over last year and a decrease of 4.59% from last month.

Fish stocks total 14,614,271 pounds of fresh frozen and 4,730,479 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows an increase of 1.94% over last year and a decrease of 6.92% from last month; while other fish in cold storage shows an increase of 14.97% over last year and a decrease of 28.04% from last month.


During the month of February 3,290,735 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 1,680,264 pounds frozen during January.
