COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, April 1, 1929.

The butter in storage amounts to 3,982,231 pounds of creamery and 81,461 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 40.65% from last year and 51.63% from last month, and dairy butter also shows decreases of 34.81% from last year and 18.95% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 13,285,712 pounds in store showing an increase of 1.15% over last year and a decrease of 7.43% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 305,585 dozen; other than cold storage 390,075 dozen; and frozen eggs 2,178,709 pounds. Cold storage eggs show a decrease of 8.47% from last year and an increase of 67.72% over last month; eggs, other than cold storage show increases of 9.58% over last year and 83.95% over last month; and frozen eggs also show increases of 185.20% and .25% over last year and last month respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 22,291,727 pounds; fresh, not frozen 4,263,984 pounds; cured, dry salted 1,560,257 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 8,482,008 pounds; in process of cure 8,145,382 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 13.25% from last year and an increase of 4.81% over last month; and fresh stocks, not frozen show increases of 9.79% over last year and 4.29% over last month. Cured, dry salted stocks show a decrease of 54.26% from last year and an increase of 9.46% over last month; cured, sweet pickled shows decreases of 36.44% from last year and 5.83% from last month; and stocks, in process of cure shows increases of 8.53% over last year and 2.64% over last month.

The lard in storage amounts to 4,358,306 pounds showing increases of 16.87% and 5.55% over last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 9,391,871 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,851,109 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 289,848 pounds of cured; and 205,751 pounds of beef, in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 9.14% over last year and a decrease of 5.95% from last month; and fresh stocks, not frozen show decreases of 24.53% from last year and 19.72% from last month. Cured stocks show increases of 150.99% over last year and 1.58% over last month; while stocks, in process of cure show an increase of 3.70% over last year and a decrease of 12.79% from last month.

Veal in storage amounts to 576,043 pounds of fresh frozen and 381,225 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 57.25% over last year and a decrease of 33.89% from last month; while stocks, not frozen show a decrease of 1.07% from last year and an increase of 88.89% over last month.

Mutton and Lamb stocks total 3,662,523 pounds of frozen and 220,571 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 9.76% over last year and a decrease of 10.04% from last month; while stocks, not frozen show increases of 59.10% and 118.59% over last year and last month respectively.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 267,360 pounds; chickens 2,506,052 pounds; fowl 830,904 pounds; ducks 78,812 pounds; geese 42,434 pounds; turkeys 1,332,402 pounds; unclassified 1,050,590 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of .94% over last year and a decrease of 19.55% from last month.

Fish stocks total 15,616,110 pounds of fresh frozen and 4,877,184 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows increases of 22.72% over last year and 6.65% over last month; while other fish in cold storage also shows increases of 15.17% and 2.82% over last year and last month respectively.

During the month of March, 2,191,509 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 3,290,735 pounds frozen during February.
