COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, MAY 1, 1929.

The butter in storage amounts to 2,562,278 pounds of creamery and 56,775 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 30.19% from last year and 35.66% from last month, and dairy butter shows an increase of 27.59% over last year and a decrease of 30.30% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 11,545,050 pounds in store, showing an increase of 5.03% over last year and a decrease of 13.10% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 5,315,043 dozen; other than cold storage 752,927 dozen; and frozen eggs 2,269,358 pounds. Cold storage eggs show increases of 20.35% over last year and 1,639.30% over last month; eggs, other than cold storage, show increases of 7.43% over last year and 92.87% over last month, while frozen eggs also show increases of 173.34% and 4.16% over last year and last month respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 23,378,970 pounds; fresh, not frozen, 3,162,273 pounds; cured, dry salted 2,193,794 pounds; cured, sweet pickled, 7,567,036 pounds; in process of cure 10,566,326 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 18.82% from last year and an increase of 4.88% over last month; and fresh stocks, not frozen, show decreases of 3.80% from last year and 25.84% from last month. Cured, dry salted stocks show a decrease of 41.04% from last year and an increase of 40.57% over last month; cured, sweet pickled show decrease of 32.87% from last year and 10.79% from last month; while stocks in process of cure show increases of 45.83% over last year and 29.72% over last month.

The lard in storage amounts to 5,070,083 pounds, showing increases of 35.41% and 16.32% over last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 7,302,601 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,508,963 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 428,265 pounds of cured, and 171,756 pounds in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 21.41% over last year and a decrease of 22.25% from last month, and fresh stocks, not frozen, show decreases of 27.08% from last year and 8.89% from last month. Cured stocks show increases of 277.07% over last year and 47.69% over last month; while stocks in process of cure show an increase of 14.04% over last year and a decrease of 16.52% from last month.


Veal in storage amounts to 741,214 pounds of fresh frozen and 474,672 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 58.70% over last year and 28.67% over last month; and stocks fresh, not frozen, show a decrease of 13.04% from last year and an increase of 24.51% over last month.

Mutton and Lamb stocks total 2,559,356 pounds of frozen and 413,443 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 29.98% over last year and a decrease of 30.12% from last month; while stocks, not frozen, show increases of 354.22% and 87.44% over last year and last month respectively.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- Broilers 228,890 pounds; chickens 1,956,336 pounds; fowl 503,454 pounds; ducks 55,258 pounds; geese 38,195 pounds; turkeys 1,176,110 pounds; unclassified 965,938 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of 3.63% over last year and a decrease of 19.39% from last month.

Fish stocks total 13,564,565 pounds of fresh frozen and 4,141,381 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows an increase of 10.08% over last year and a decrease of 12.97% from last month; while other fish in cold storage shows decreases of 15.40% and 14.86% from last year and last month respectively.

During the month of April 884,002 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 2,191,509 pounds frozen during March.
