COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, JULY 1, 1929.

The butter in storage amounts to 11,236,780 pounds of creamery and 198,555 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows a decrease of 5.98% from last year and an increase of 260.26% over last month; and dairy butter also shows a decrease of 30.09% from last year and an increase of 196.86% over last month.

Cheese stocks total 17,975,900 pounds, showing increases of 7.94% and 71.05% over last year and last month respectively.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 16,473,211 dozen; other than cold storage 814,802 dozen; and frozen eggs 3,480,009 pounds. Cold storage eggs show increases of 8.45% over last year and 34.17% over last month; other than cold storage eggs show an increase of 59.35% over last year and a decrease of 18.56% from last month, while frozen eggs show increases of 15.50% and 24.14% over last year and last month respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 15,427,527 pounds; fresh, not frozen 3,669,130 pounds; cured, dry salted 1,732,902 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 9,187,246 pounds; in process of cure 8,401,887 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 37.19% from last year and 25.87% from last month, while fresh stocks, not frozen, show increases of 20.79% over last year and 40.87% over last month. Cured, dry salted, stocks show decreases of 46.51% from last year and 31.35% from last month; cured, sweet pickled, show a decrease of 22.78% from last year and an increase of 1.25% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show an increase of 15.30% over last year, and a decrease of 6.14% from last month.

The Lard in storage amounts to 5,972,596 pounds, showing increases of 45.16% and 11.84% over last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 3,013,018 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,603,883 pounds of fresh not frozen; 292,887 pounds of cured, and 198,428 pounds of stocks in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 3.45% from last year and 37.79% from last month; and fresh stocks, not frozen, also show decreases of 21.87% from last year and 11.77% from last month. Cured stocks show an increase of 93.29% over last year and a decrease of 20.53% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show a decrease of 6.88% from last year and an increase of 33.37% over last month.

The veal in storage amounts to 1,439,084 pounds of fresh frozen and 553,611 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 128.33% over last year and 22.97% over last month; and fresh stocks, not frozen, show an increase of 18.12% over last year and a decrease of 9.09% from last month.

Mutton and Lamb stocks total 671,421 pounds of frozen and 165,249 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 25.97% over last year and a decrease of 47.80% from last month; and stocks, not frozen, show decreases of 24.17% and 43.36% from last year and last month respectively.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 120,219 pounds; chickens 999,644 pounds; fowl 304,871 pounds; ducks 45,311 pounds; geese 34,308 pounds; turkeys 996,312 pounds; unclassified 550,398 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of 9.03% over last year and a decrease of 21.34% from last month.

Fish stocks total 16,247,752 pounds of fresh frozen and 5,156,580 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows a decrease of 1.34% from last year and an increase of 26.23% over last month; and other fish in cold storage also shows a decrease of 12.06% from last year and an increase of 16.91% over last month.

During the month of June, 4,860,648 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 2,137,081 pounds frozen during May.

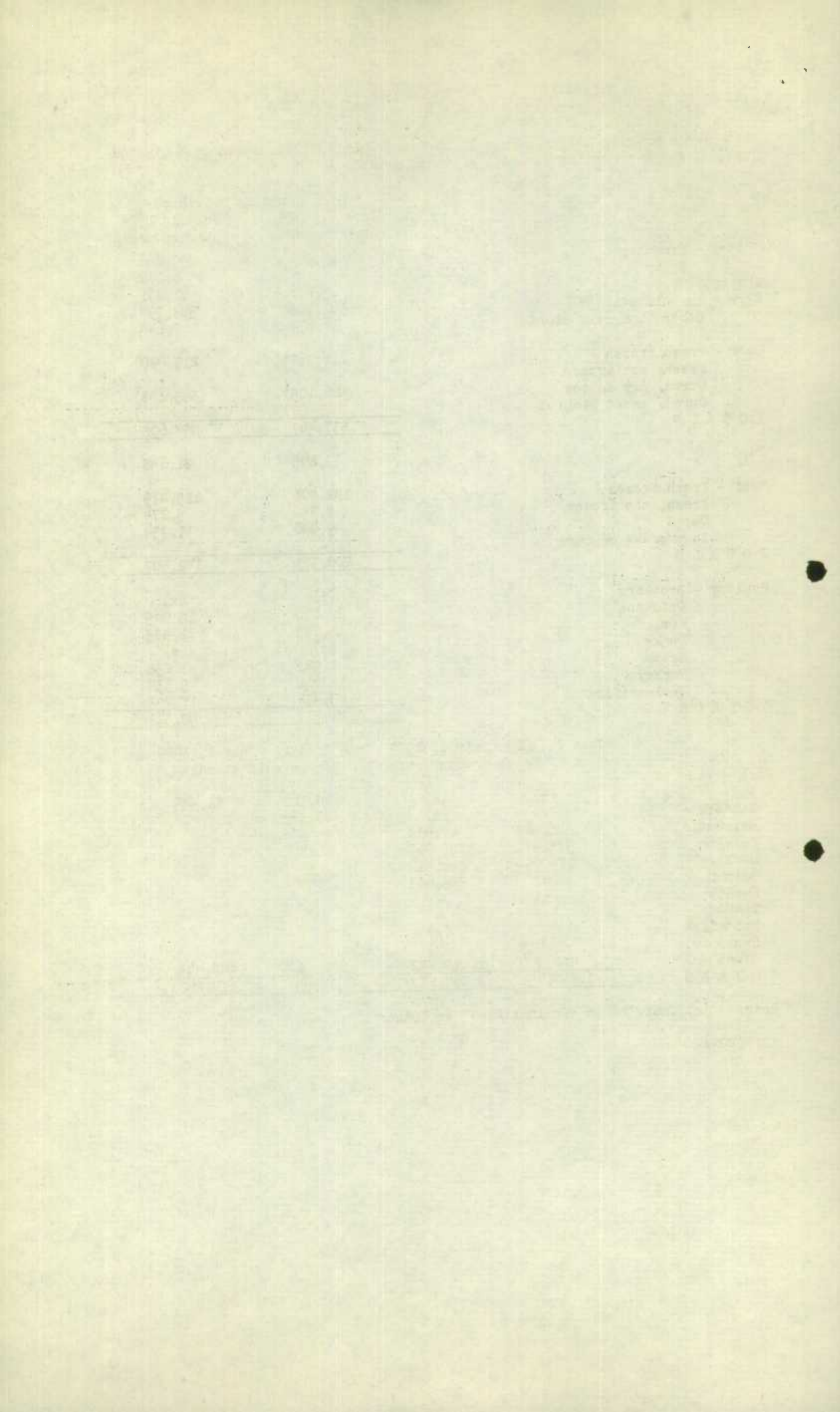
