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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, NOVEMBER 1, 1930.

The butter in cold storage amounts to 33,844,099 pounds of creamery and 527,299 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows an increase of 44.32% over last year and a decrease of 10.79% from last month; while dairy butter shows decreases of 6.55% and 44.52% from last year and last month respectively.

Cheese stocks total 24,800,773 pounds showing an increase of 1.65% over last year and a decrease of 20.67% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 12,285,275 dozen; other than cold storage 706,366 dozen; and frozen eggs 4,205,469 pounds. Cold storage eggs show an increase of 36.03% over last year and a decrease of 19.85% from last month; other than cold storage eggs also show an increase of 72.53% over last year and a decrease of 55.61% from last month; while frozen eggs show increases of 32.24% and 3.46% over last year and last month respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 2,878,467 pounds; fresh not frozen 2,675,137 pounds; cured, dry salted 889,931 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 4,649,941 pounds; in process of cure 5,673,595 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 13.30% from last year and 15.35% from last month; fresh stocks, not frozen show a decrease of 3.64% from last year and an increase of 21.00% over last month; cured dry salted stocks show decreases of 29.17% from last year and 34.90% from last month; cured, sweet pickled also show decreases of 30.17% from last year and 13.95% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show a decrease of 7.75% from last year and an increase of 9.02% over last month.

The lard in storage amounts to 1,362,933 pounds showing decreases of 51.74% and 10.30% from last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 5,118,274 pounds of frozen; 4,975,928 pounds of not frozen; 307,018 pounds of cured; and 110,521 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 48.23% from last year and an increase of 33.13% over last month; fresh stocks not frozen also show a decrease of 17.57% from last year and an increase of 8.65% over last month; cured stocks show an increase of 22.70% over last year and a decrease of 31.21% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show decreases of 44.18% from last year and 71.23% from last month.

The veal in cold storage amounts to 2,074,409 pounds of fresh frozen and 744,485 pounds of fresh not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 17.19% from last year and an increase of 10.71% over last month; and fresh stocks not frozen show increases of 3.84% over last year and 65.10% over last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 4,142,211 pounds of frozen and 851,151 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show increases of 2.08% over last year and 188.95% over last month; and fresh stocks not frozen also show increases of 29.65% over last year and 92.95% over last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 202,231 pounds; chickens 818,755 pounds; fowl 512,927 pounds; ducks 93,336 pounds; geese 42,525 pounds; turkeys 349,052 pounds; unclassified 769,198 pounds. Total poultry shows a decrease of 24.29% from last year and an increase of 7.32% over last month.

Fish stocks total 30,244,378 pounds of frozen and 6,397,586 pounds of smoked and other varieties. Frozen fish shows increases of 11.15% and 4.60% over last year and last month respectively; and smoked and other varieties show an increase of 17.09% over last year and a decrease of 11.56% from last month.

During the month of October 3,988,761 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 3,990,323 pounds frozen during September.
